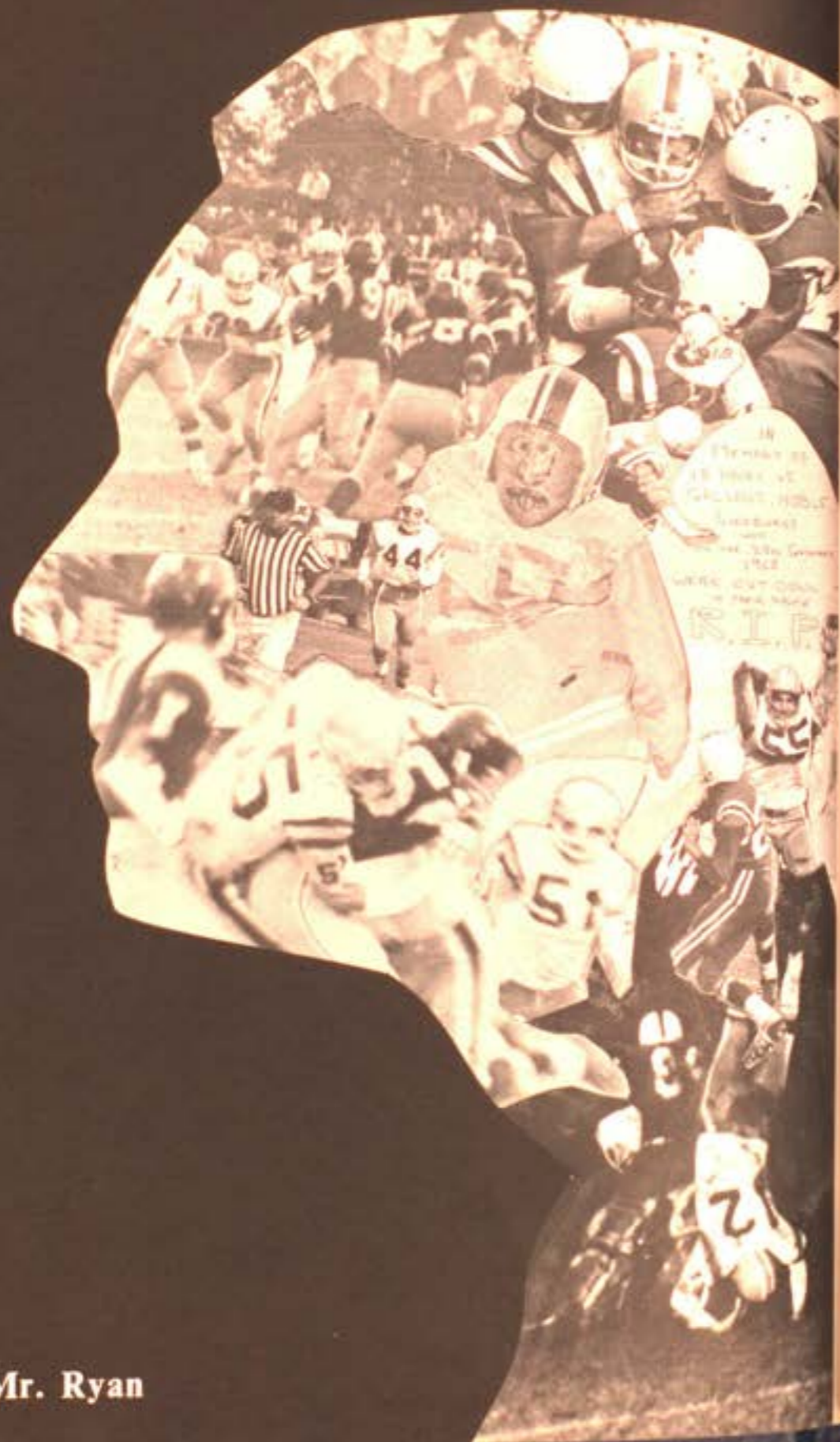

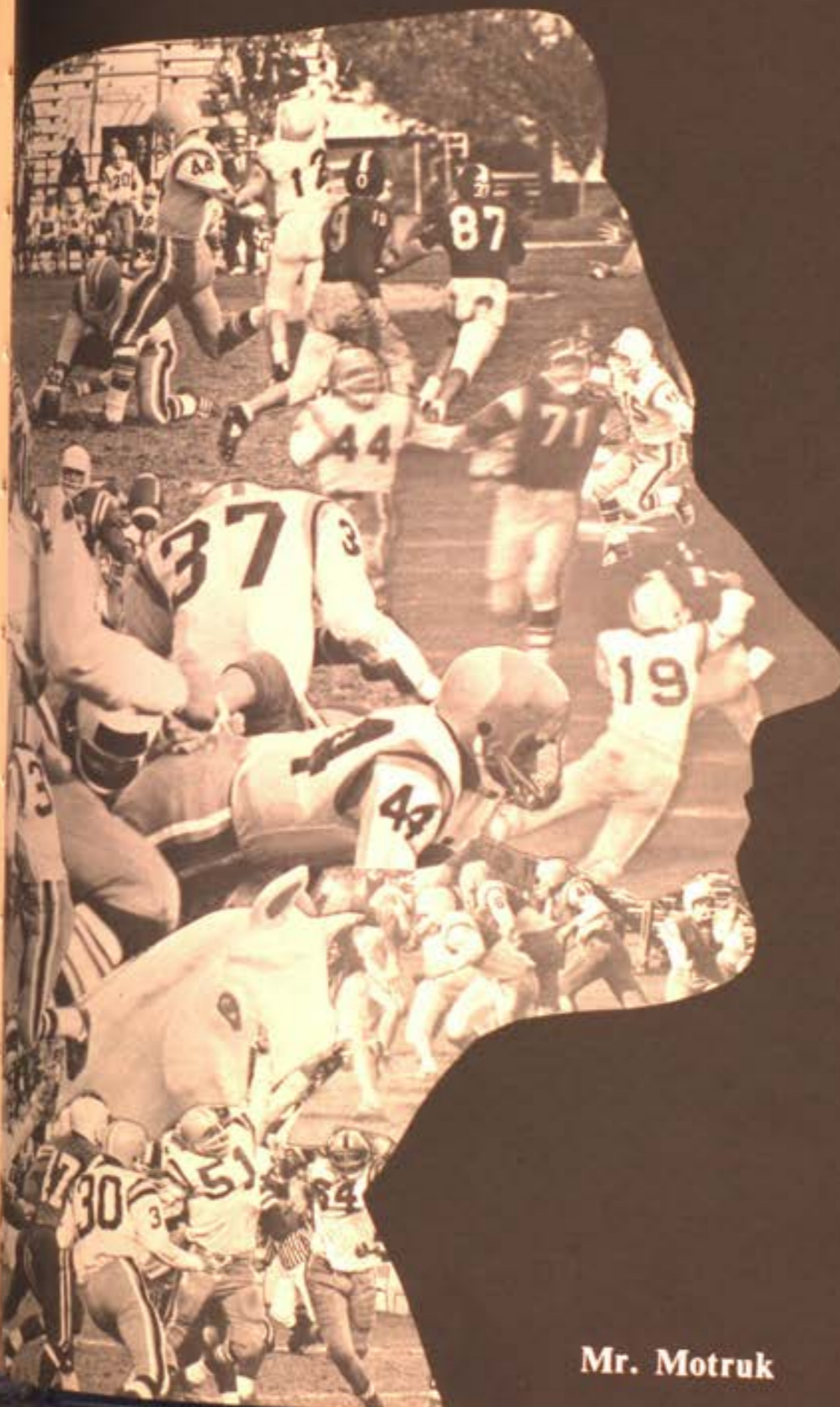

believe this as he exclaimed to his wife behind, "Oh no, they can't do it!" But the Mustangs did, winning, going away, 62-55.

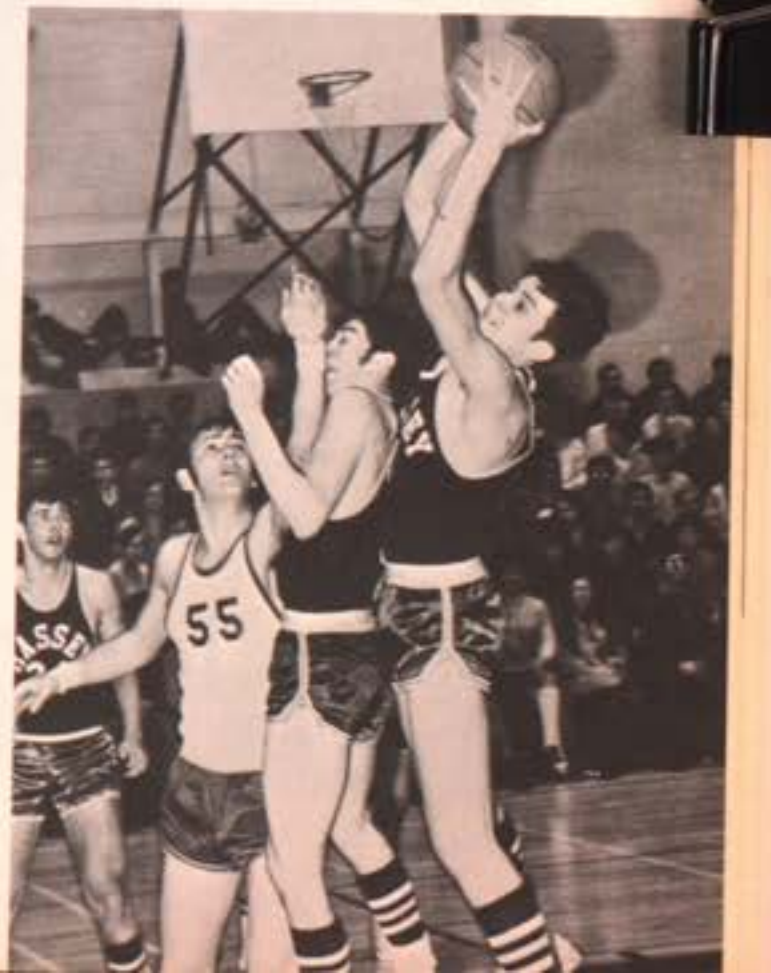
Now, Massey was to play its biggest game of the year against the defending champions Assumption Purple Raiders.

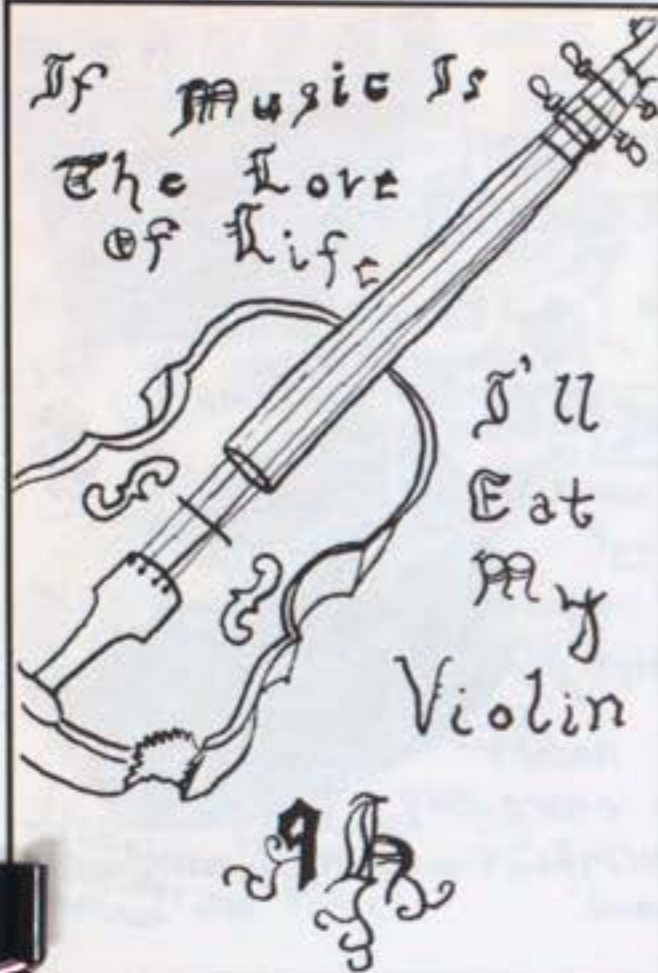
