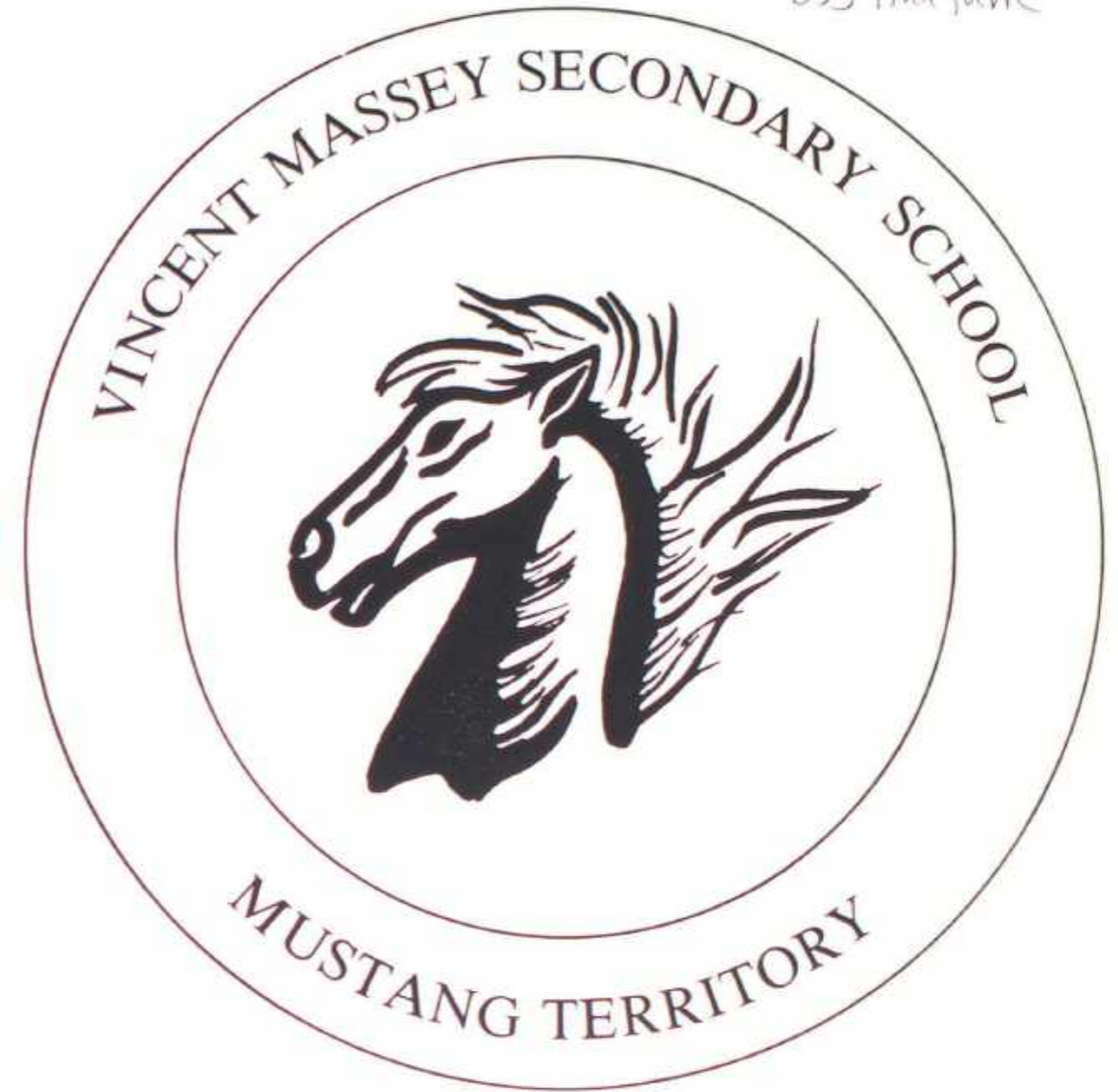

OUR SCHOOL'S NAMESAKE

Vincent Massey S.S. was named after the first Canadian-born governor-general, Vincent Massey.

Vincent Massey was born in the year 1887, in Toronto. He was educated at St. Andrews College, Toronto, the University of Toronto, Balliol College, and Oxford University. After holding several minor posts, he was appointed minister without portfolio in the Dominion cabinet in 1925 and was Canadian minister to the U.S. from 1926-1930. He was governor-general of Canada from 1952-1959. Just prior to his appointment, Massey wrote the "Massey Report" which contained his evaluation of the status of Canadian arts and culture and his recommendations for government subsidies to the arts. This report has since become an integral part of national policy. Massey has also written numerous books, such as ON BEING A CANADIAN (1948).

PEGASUS

Our yearbook's protector, Pegasus, can find his origins in Greek mythology: a magnificent winged horse, son of Poseidon, god of the sea and the gorgon Medusa. Pegasus was born by springing from the gorgon's neck when she was killed by Perseus. Many longed to tame this creature, whose hoof had caused a sacred spring to form on Mt. Helicon, but only one, Bellerophon, Prince of Corinth, was given this privilege. On the advice of a seer, Bellerophon spent the night in the temple of the goddess Athena. When he woke he found a golden bridle left for him by Athena. With it he easily captured and tamed Pegasus. The winged horse and Bellerophon had many great adventures together. However, Bellerophon was overcome by his own pride and attempted to ride Pegasus to Mt. Olympus. The wise horse threw him and travelled to the home of the gods to be given shelter in the Olympian stalls. Bellerophon was left to wander the earth, hated by the gods. Pegasus, however, was given the duty of bringing Zeus' lightning and thunderbolts to him whenever the god required them.



OUR SCHOOL CREST

Our school crest was designed in 1960 by the first principal, Robert Bass, and his wife. The crest is blue on a white background. The "M" in the middle represents Massey. The Latin words, "Dum Laboramus Prosumus", means "As long as we are working, we are progressing."

A BRIEF HISTORY OF MASSEY SECONDARY SCHOOL

The history of Massey is one of great change and growth. The Collegiate was named in honour of the first Canadian Governor General of Canada, the Right Honourable Vincent Massey. In the fall of 1960, although the original building was not yet completed, Massey opened its doors to the students of Sandwich West Township. With a teaching staff of twenty-four under the leadership of Mr. R.W. Bass, Principal, and Mr. Pentland, Vice-Principal, the school enrolled some five hundred students who were placed in nineteen classes. There was no grade thirteen and only eight grade nine classes. At this writing in 1969, there are 15 grade nine classes, 7 grade thirteens, and the school has a teaching staff of 94.

The design of the school was the very latest in 1960, and the blue facade of the building determined the school's colours - double blue and white. In a very short time the motto "Dum Laboramus Prosumus" had a fine ring, and so the teams were to be known as the "Mustangs". Other decisions had to be made, including the naming of the magazine "Pegasus", the writing of a school song, and a constitution for the council. That first year was one of great challenge for all concerned.

The challenge continued as the enrollment soared, necessitating an addition to the academic wing within two years. At the end of these two years both the Principal and Vice-Principal had been promoted and replaced by Mr. R.B. Whetstone, and Mr. H.L. Ward respectively. From September 1964 to June 1966 the school operated on an 8.20 to 4.20 "shift" basis until a massive addition to the school was completed. A second gymnasium, swimming pool and a new cafeteria, as well as a second academic wing and shops were added. The unique partnership of the Windsor Suburban High School Board and the Windsor Board of Education, ended in 1966 with annexation of Sandwich West to the City of Windsor. In 1966 as well, the title Collegiate Institute was dropped in favour of Secondary School, as Massey became a fully "composite" school. In the same year, Mr. Ward was promoted, to be replaced by two vice-principals, Mr. H. Nighswander and Mr. M. Saffran.

In 1968 a new resource centre and library as well as a ten room addition was completed. Mr. S. Krewench was appointed as principal to succeed Mr. R.B. Whetstone.

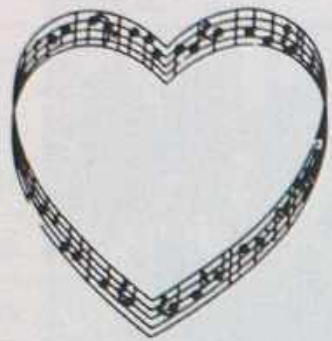

MUSTANG ATHLETICS

Massey first opened its doors in 1960 and students from a newly developed area came, bringing with them the spirit and morale of the long established high schools attended.

We quickly found out that it was up to us to build programs that we had taken for granted in the past, and so, we got down to it.

The early years produced championship golf teams under the leadership of Don Henry and our football program developed with Don McPhail, Bill Welsh, Larry Tesarshi, and Fred Hall, qualifying for all-city placements in 1962 and 63. In 1964 our football team was in the play-offs. Motruk and Ryan teamed up in 1965 and football at Massey became a dominant force in Windsor with championships in 1966, 67, 68.

At the same time, Gymnastics flourished under Ross Edwards and later Gray. Boys' and Girls' Volleyball began to dominate for six years. Between 1966-83 our swimming, diving and water polo teams kept the halls filled with trophies.

We will never forget; the 1973 Senior Boys' Basketball team coached by Wayne Curtain and featuring Rick Stanko, Scott Windsor, Andy Laliberty, Kevin Greenwood and Doug Towere; the years that "Morris" the mustang was paraded around Windsor Stadium as our football teams triumphed; the boys' and girls' volleyball teams for 1967-81 that made other schools fearful; the girls' basketball dynasty from 1974-83 featuring Misty Thomas, Tricia Blue and Tricia Hyland; or the year (1982) that our football team shocked the city by winning it all; Tricia Hyland playing for Michigan State; Misty Thomas receiving the Royal Arcanum Award and playing at U.N.L.V. and the Canadian Olympic Team; Matt St. Louis; prominence in the world of golf; and naturally, that big blue horse that appeared from time to time to taunt our athletic foes.

Looking back over the last 25 years at Massey, it is difficult to mention all the fine teams and players that have contributed to the growth and pride of the school. This pride has permeated the walls and still pulls at the hearts of the visitor, come back for one more look.

One can still stand, silently in the halls and hear the chants of the cheerleaders, the shouts of the ecstatic crowds, the encouraging voice of the coach and picture excited faces of team mates.

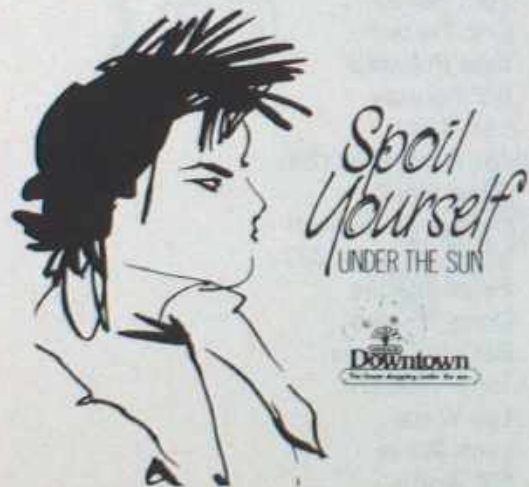
