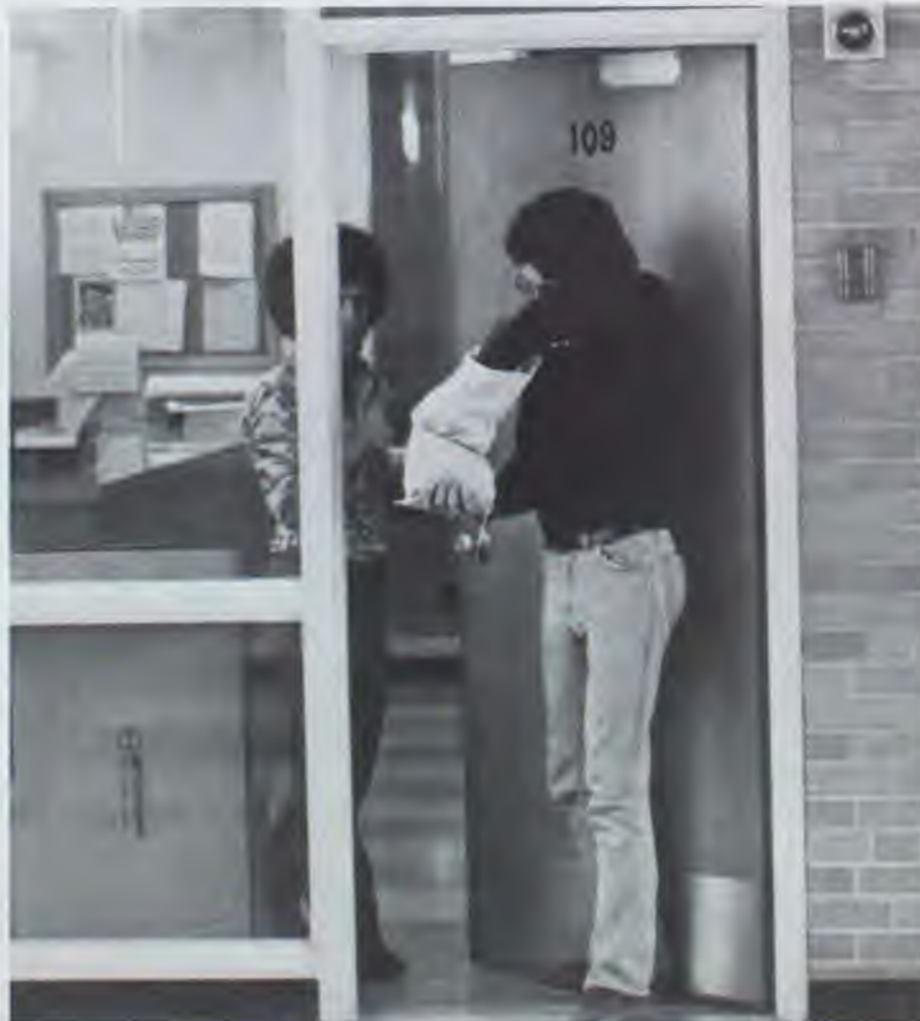

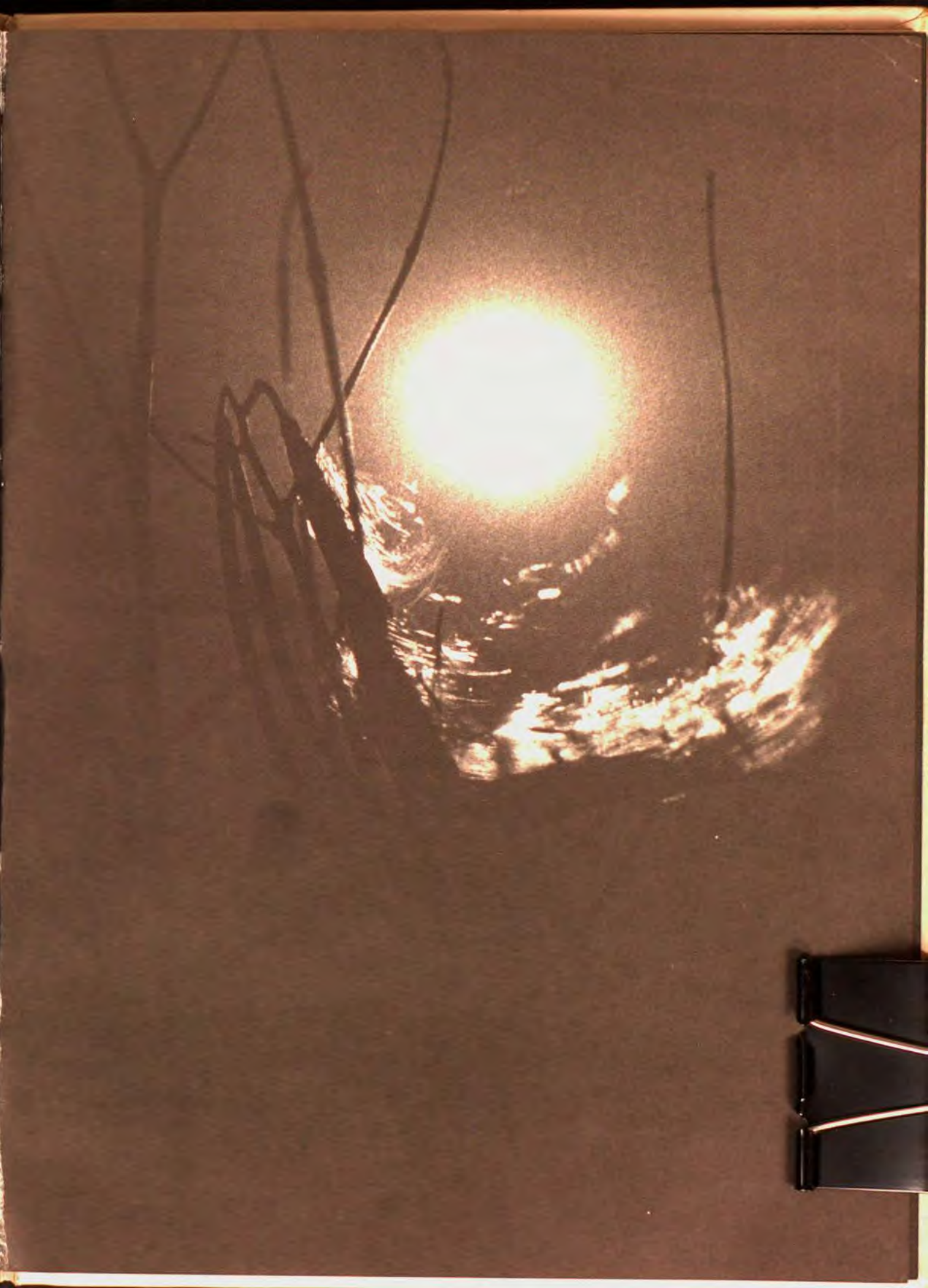

CLASSIFICATION REPORT

DOCTOR IN CHARGE: R.H. Straus

NAME OF ACTIVITY: Project Prometheus

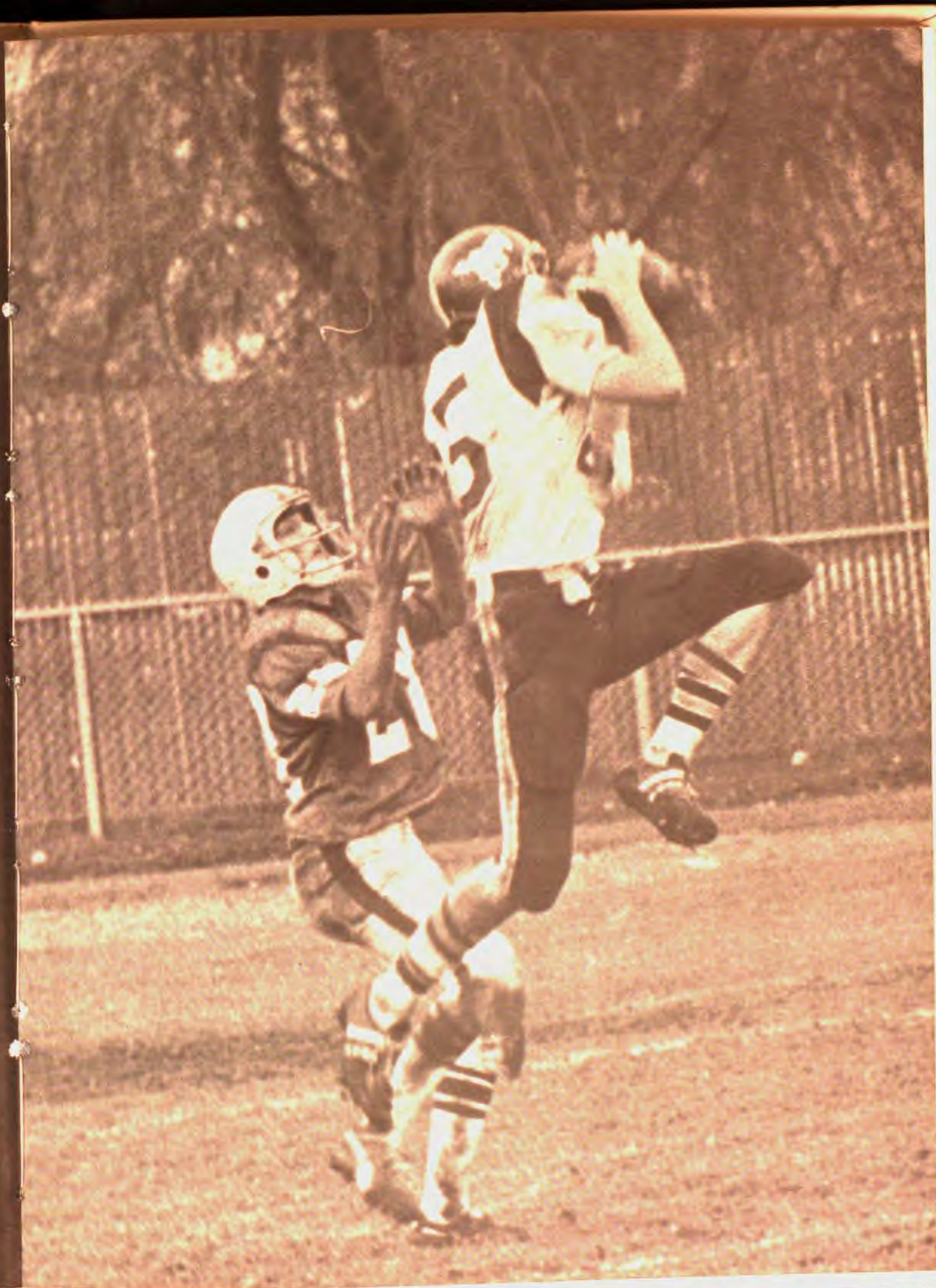

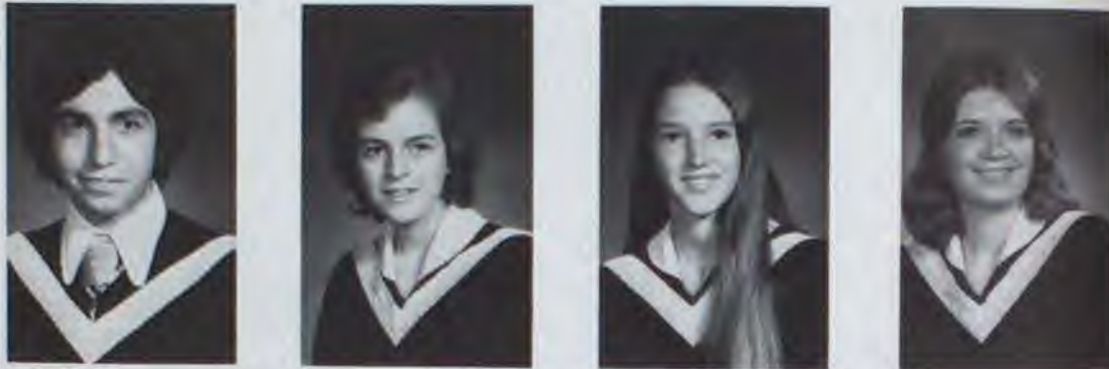

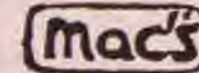
