



To the graduates: "Best of luck in your future endeavours."


To those students who remain behind: "Strive for success in your educational goals."

I wish also to give special thanks to the editor and the hard working staff of Pegasus '70 for such a fine production.


This edition of Pegasus '70 shall become a cherished and treasured memoir for the present and the future.

Remember - "Vincent Massey is our school. May it always remain that way."
















Editorial

Listen for the song of the honey bee.





THE RED BALLOON MAN


