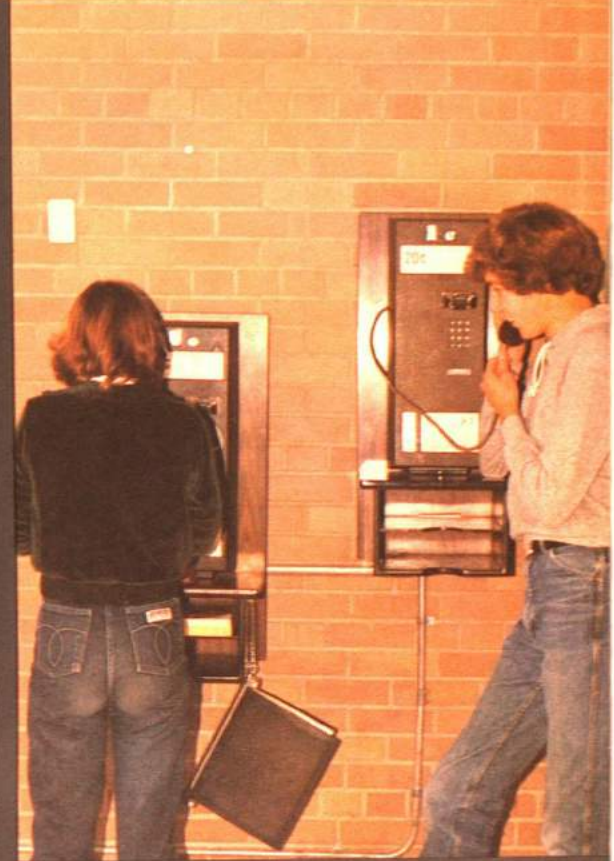


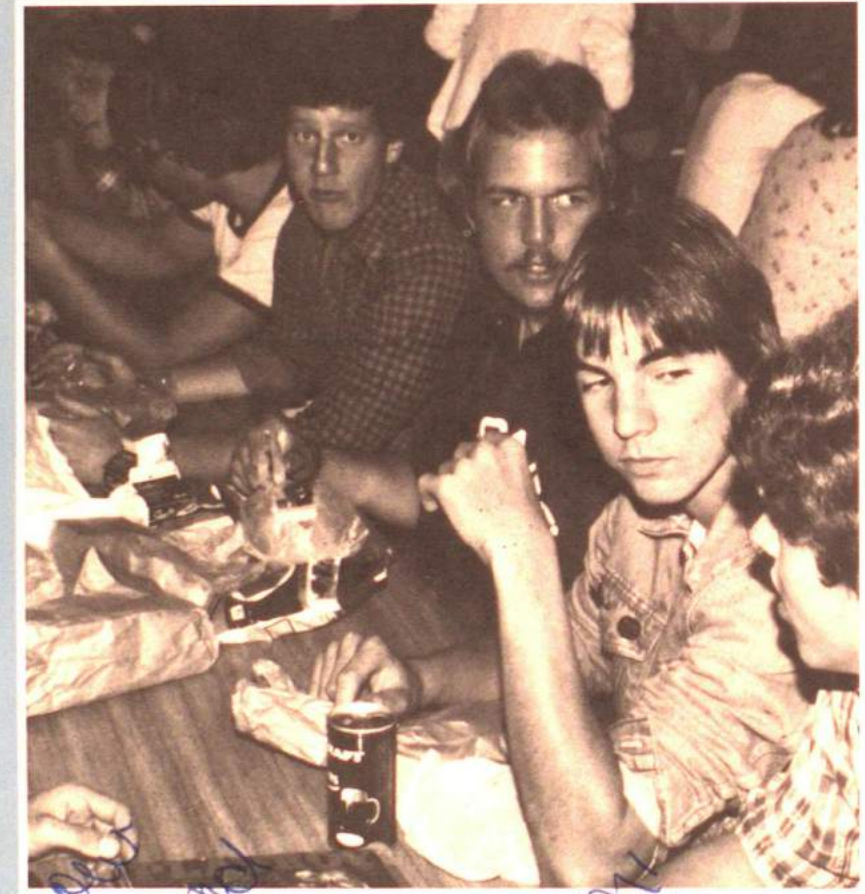
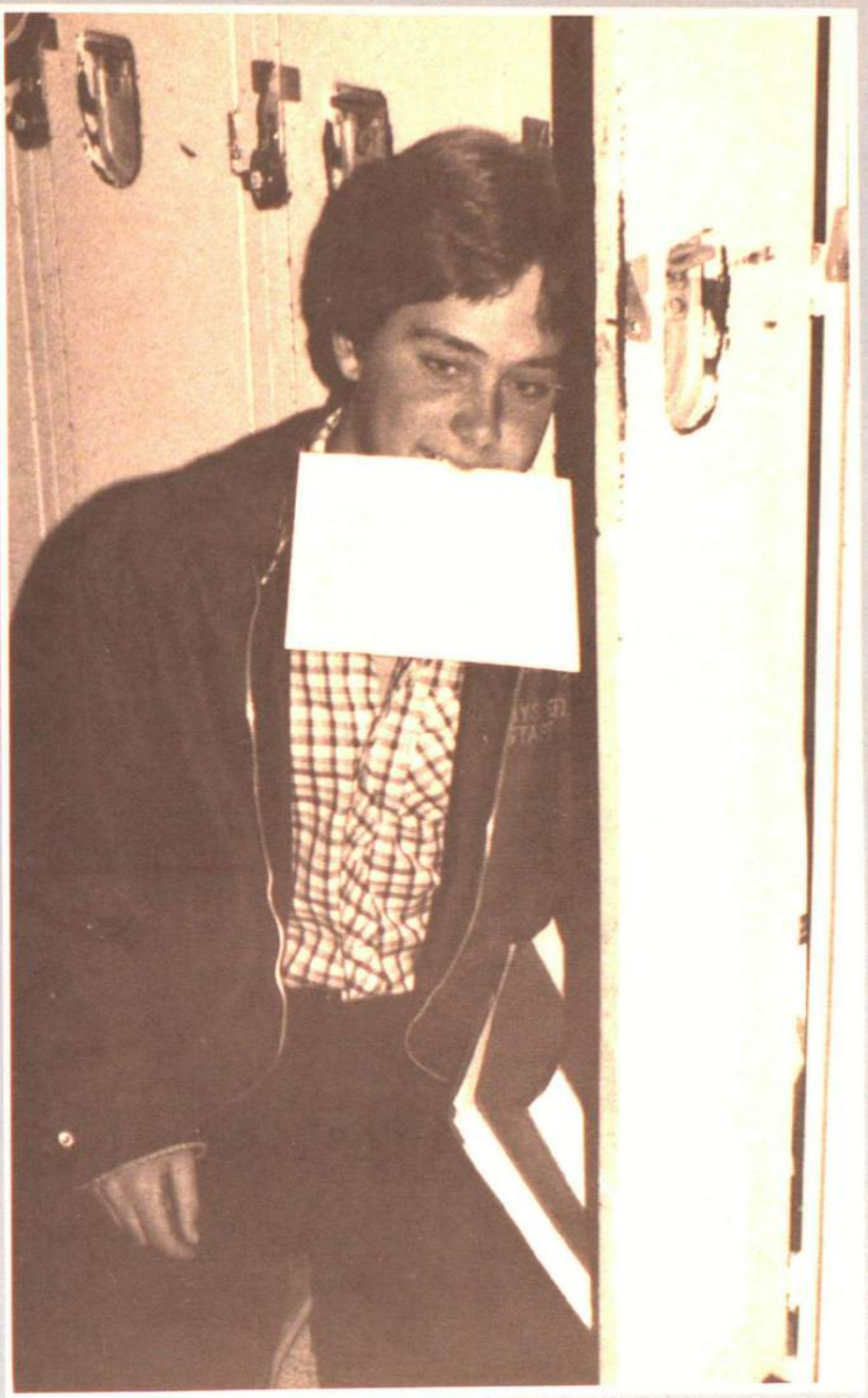


The spirit of learning pervades the halls, and memories of another year gone by haunt those who pass through.

progressed the halls humbled themselves before our expanding horizons and we each found our own place within the school's walls.



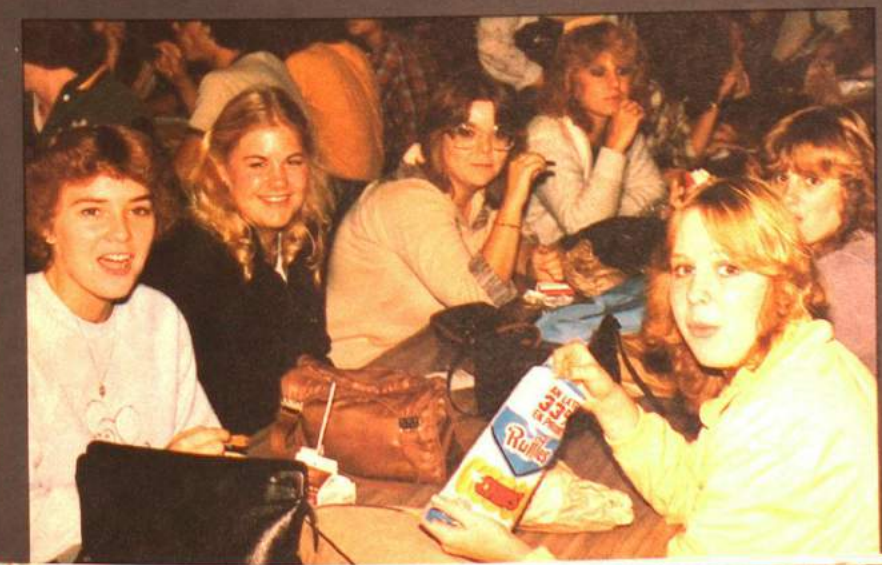
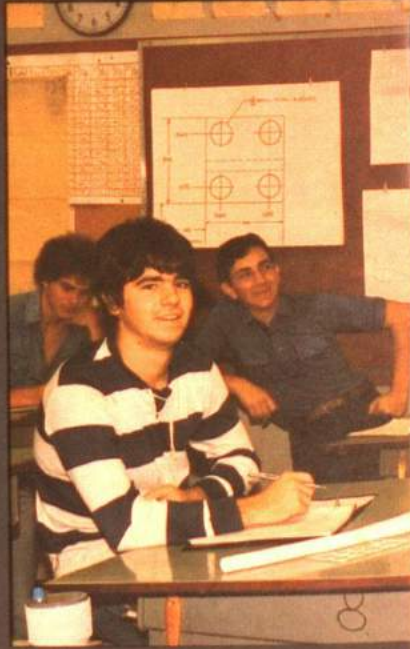
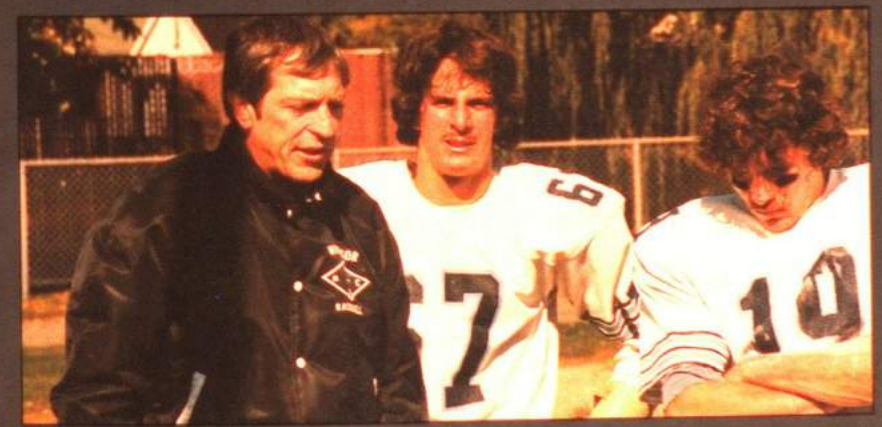
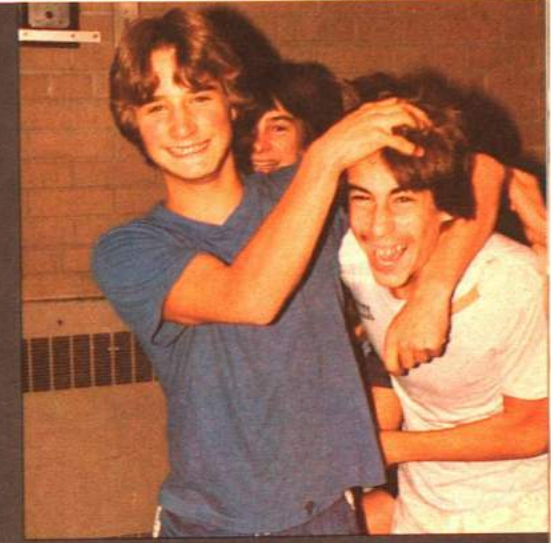
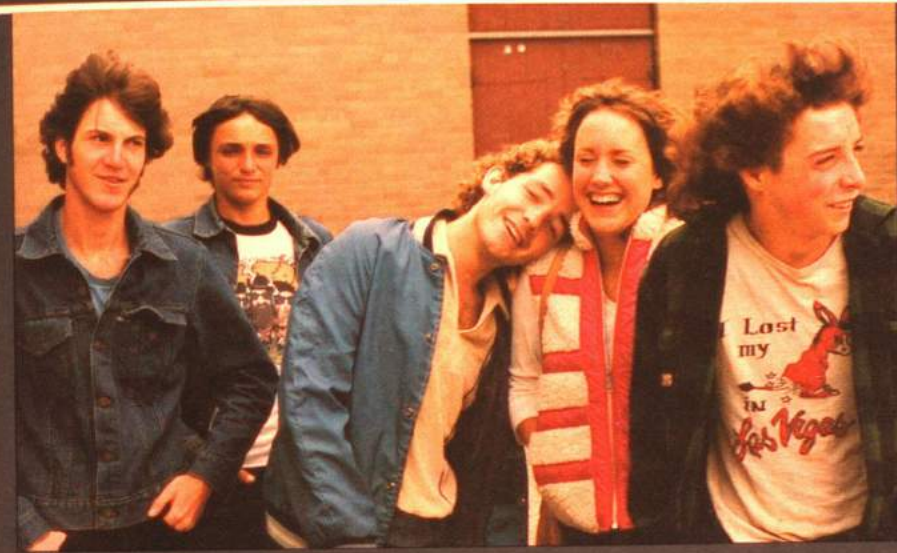


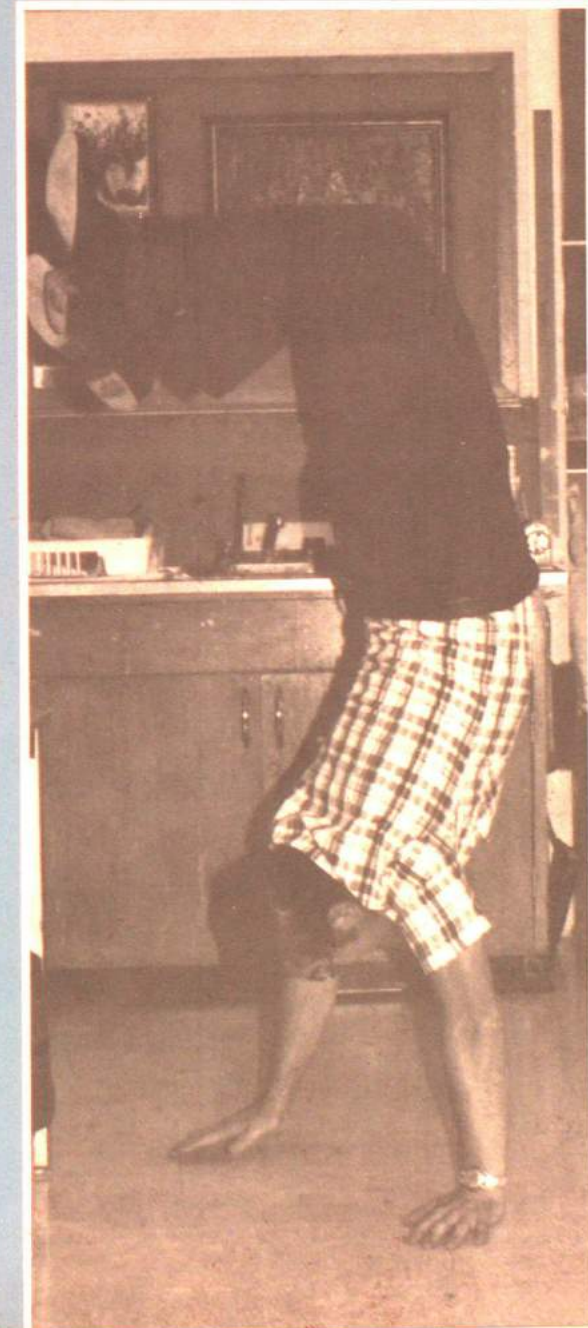
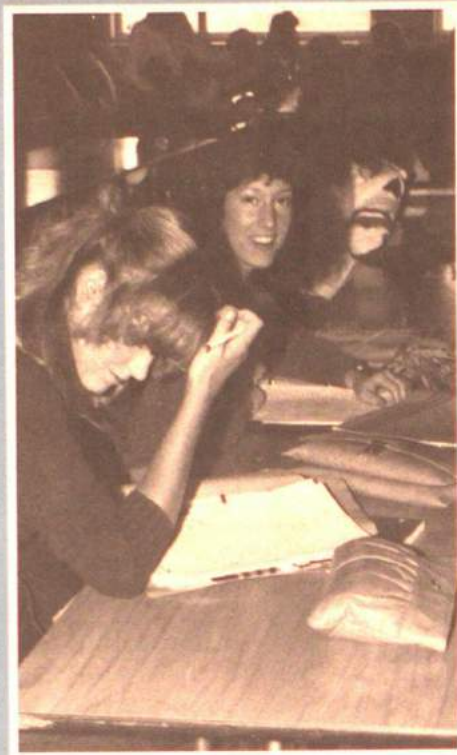

these people are as much a part of the daily routine as homework, teachers and tests. They are there to encourage us and, through influencing us, our opinions and priorities, help us to become individuals.

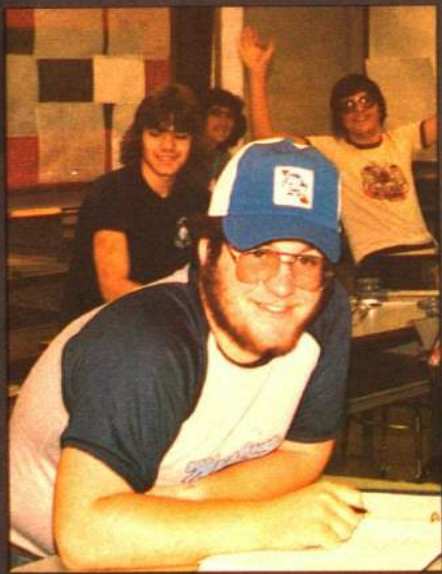
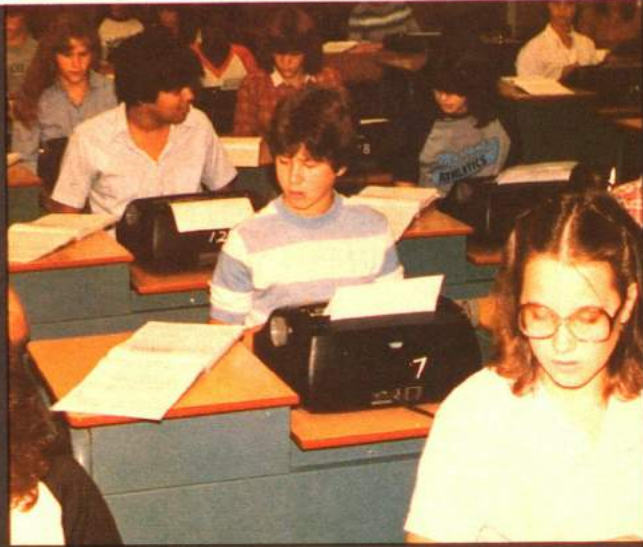


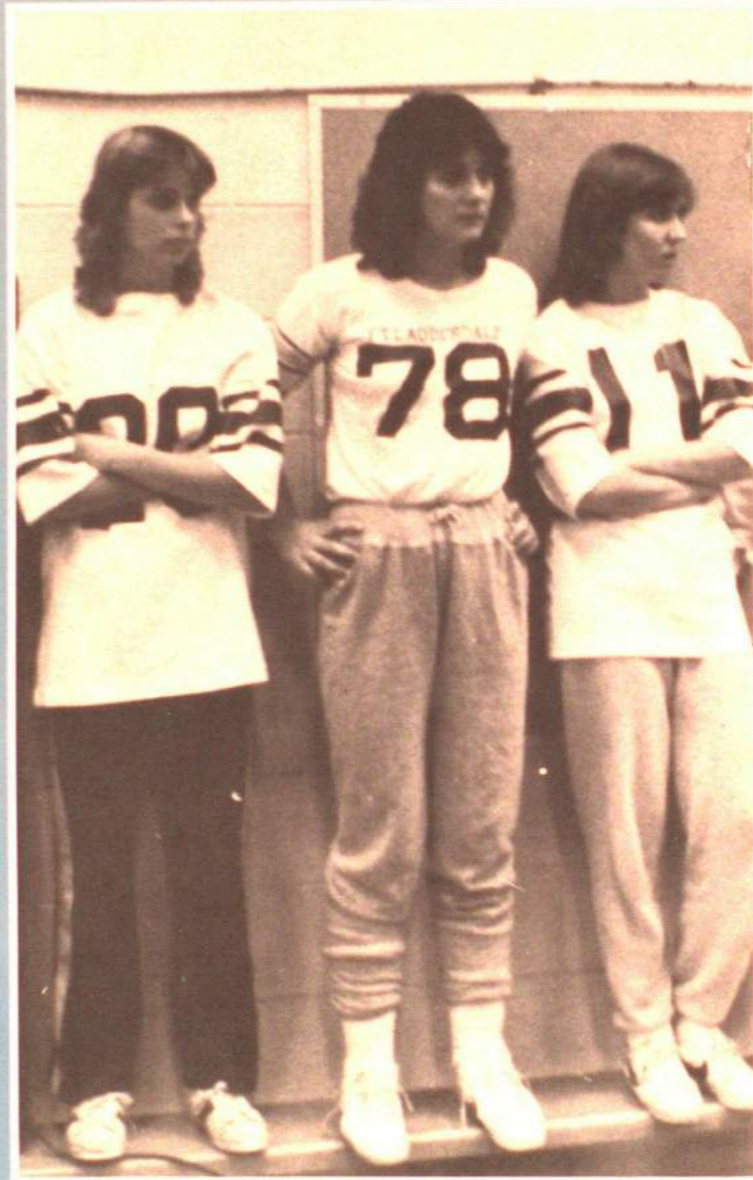


There are those who approach school with a religious fervour and others who always seek to be different.

Everyone must face the reality of work at some point in time. Each person has his/her own way of approaching obligations - some are more efficient than

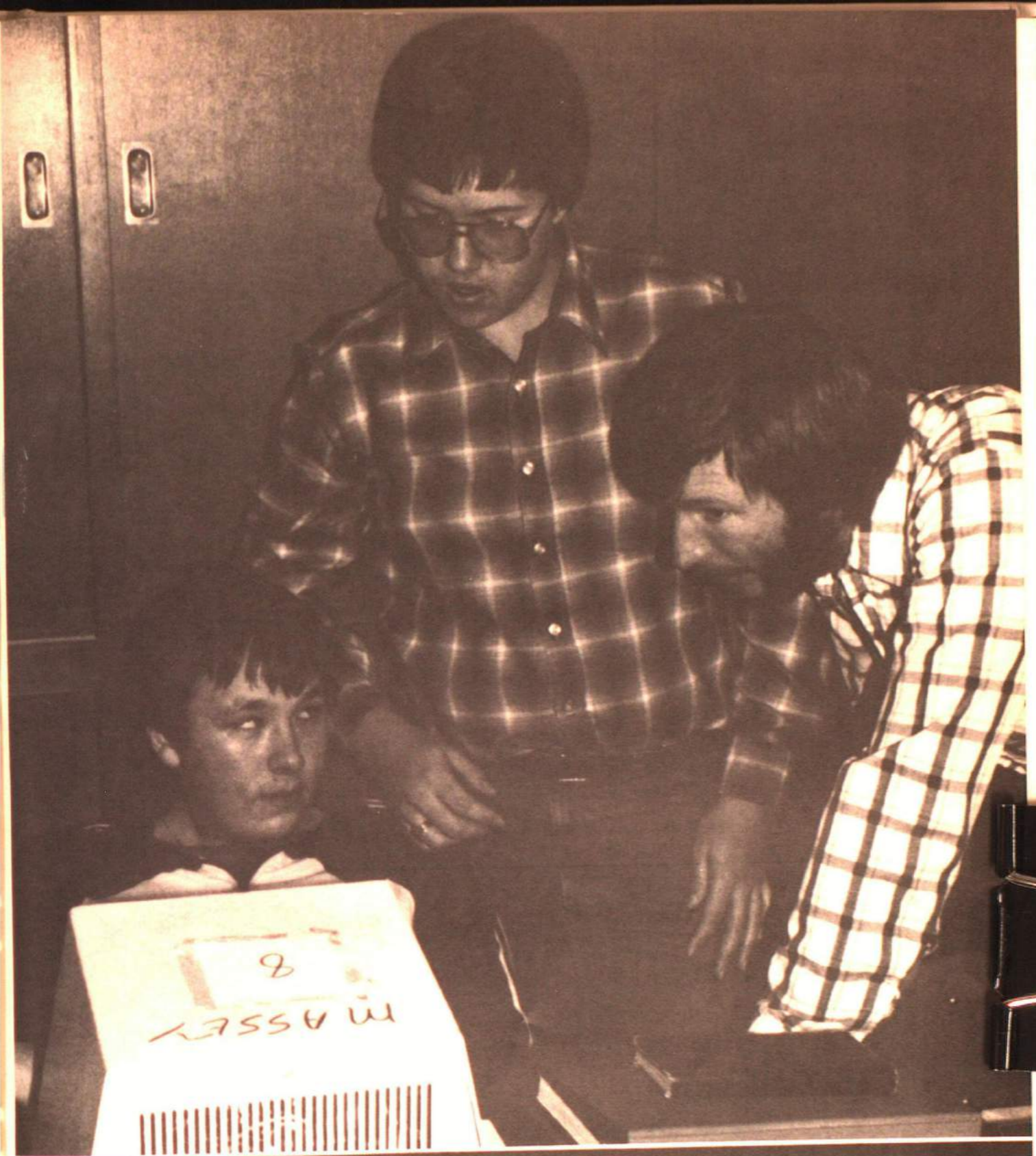
others. Wherever the atmosphere inspires diligence, students can be seen hitting the books. However, some are hopeless.

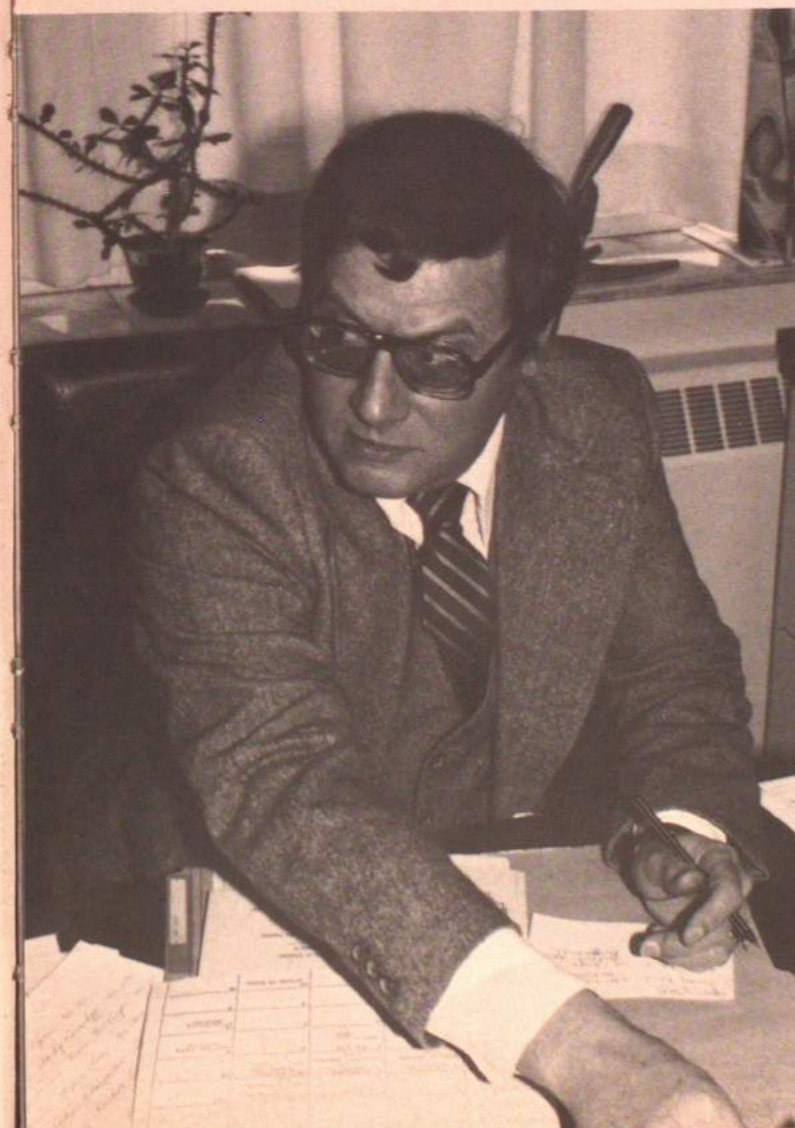
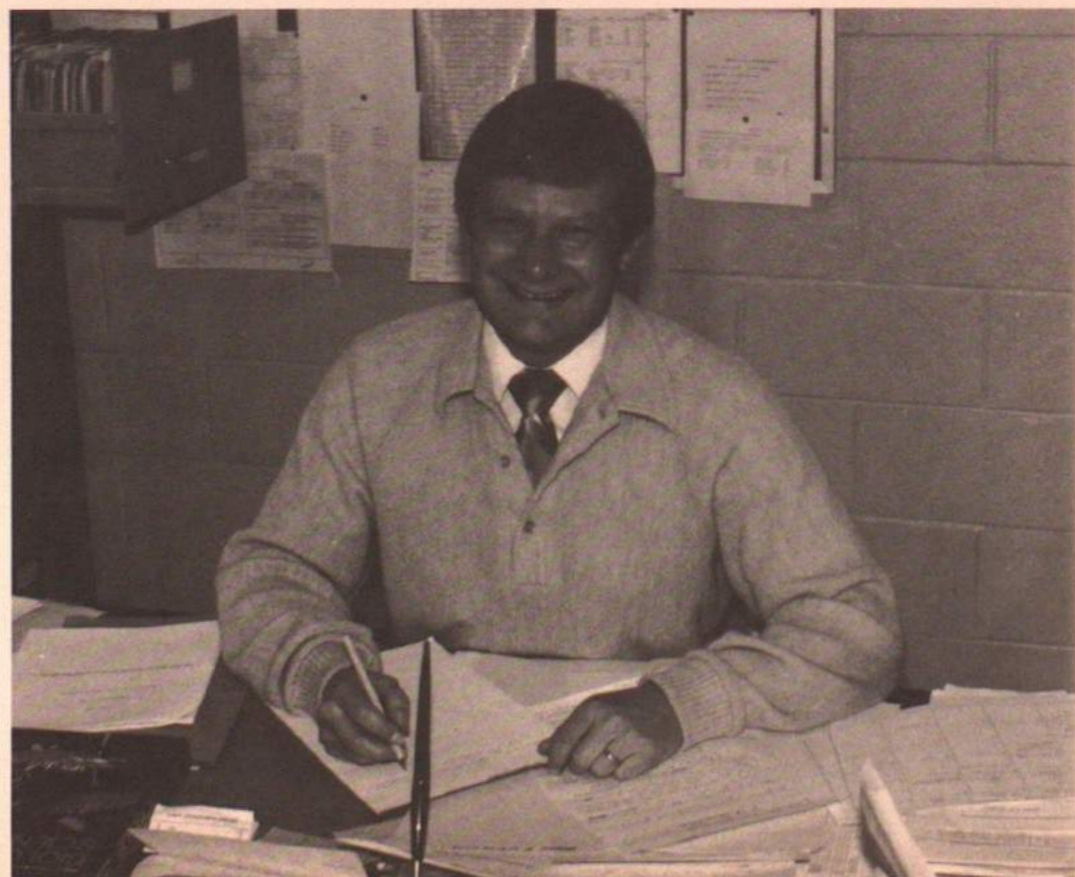
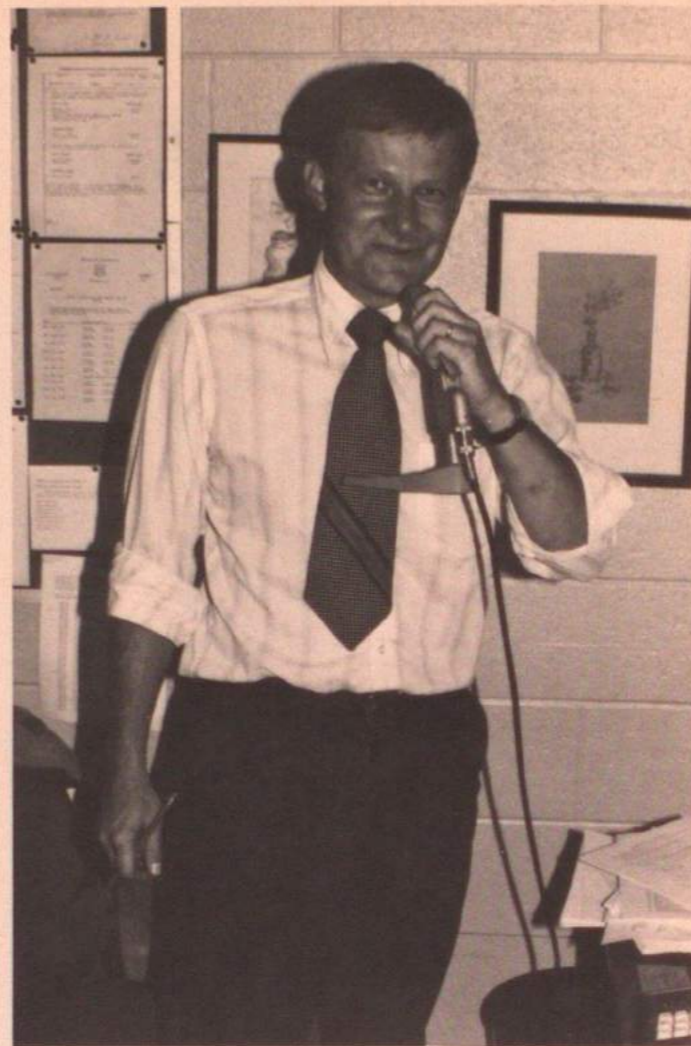
OUR VICE-PRINCIPAL

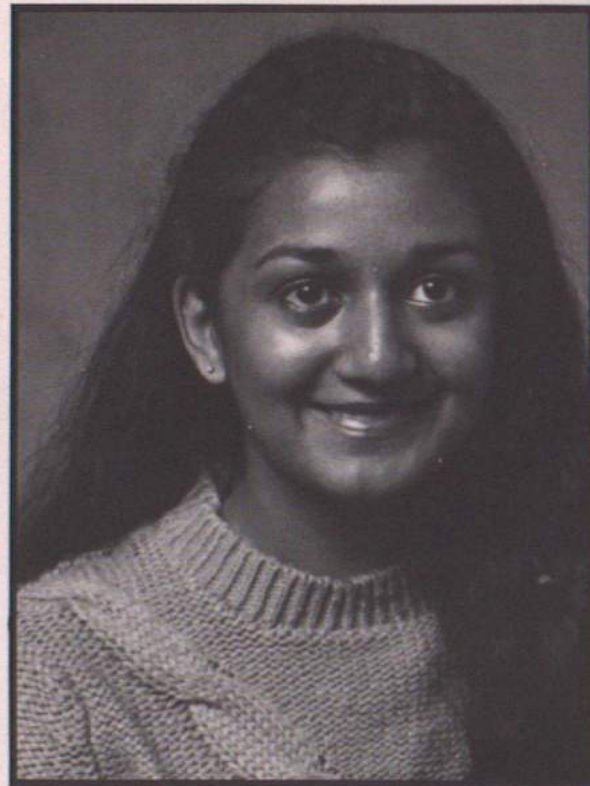
IN RETROSPECT . . .

SUCCESSFUL SEASON FOR SENIORS

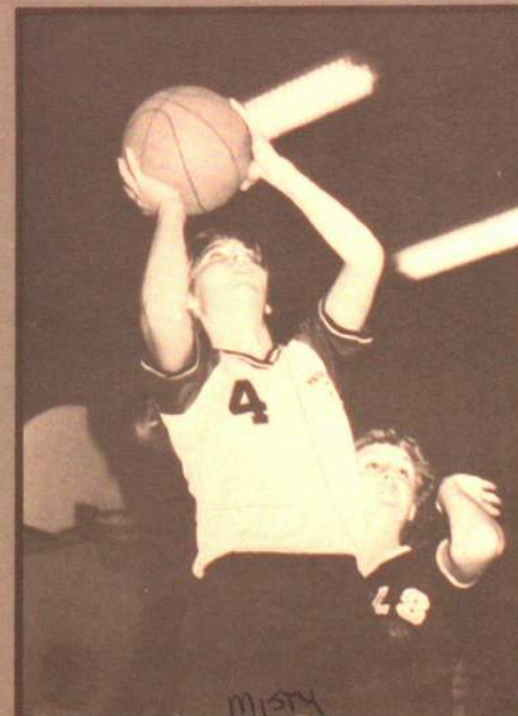

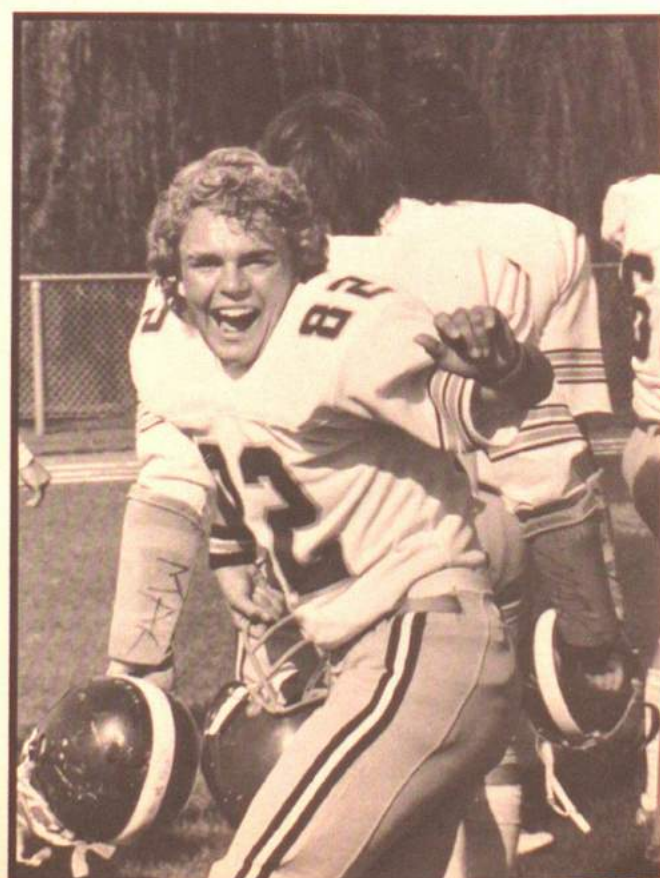
SENIOR MUSTANGS

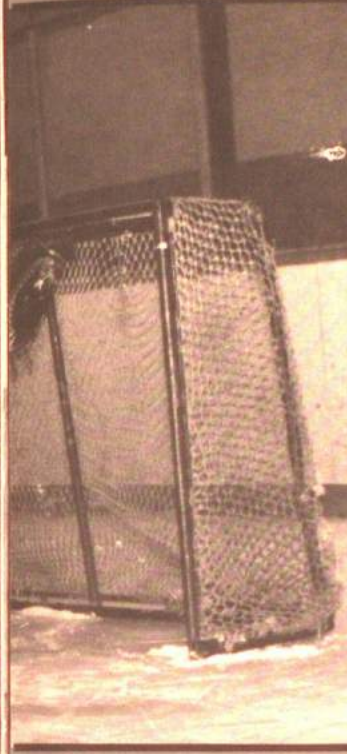
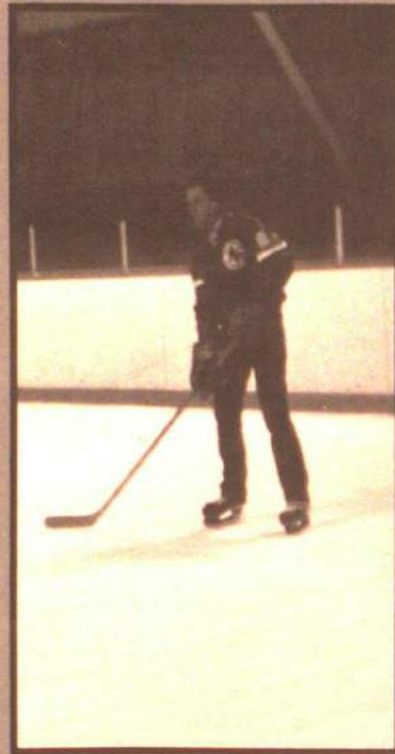

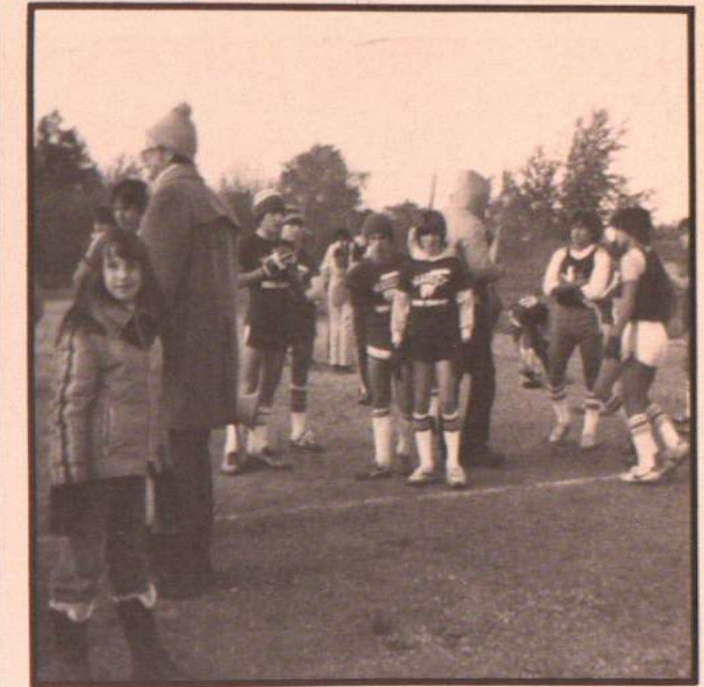
CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMPS!!

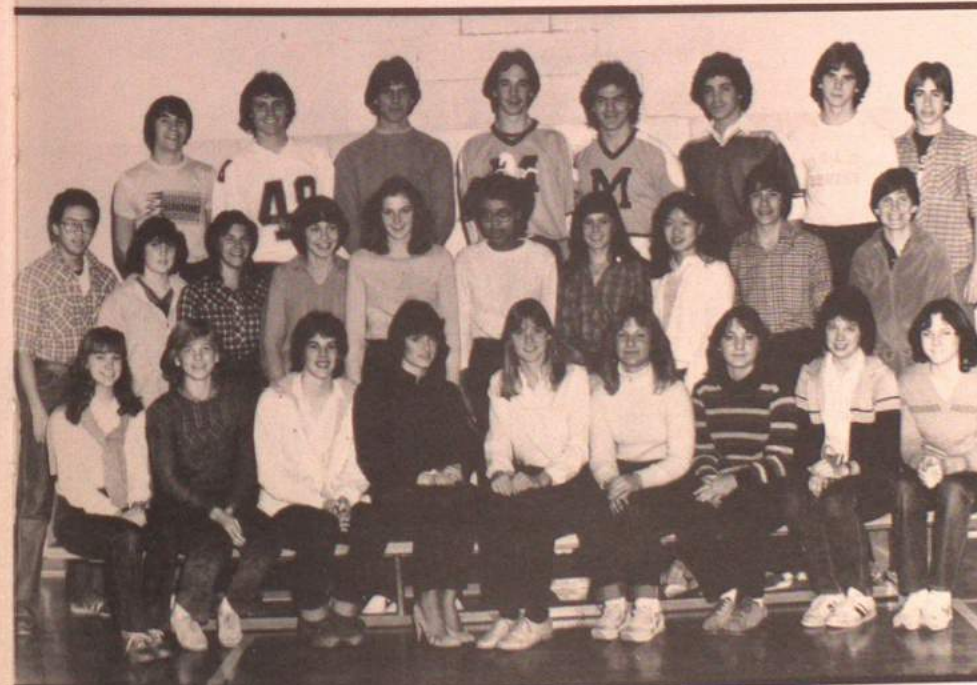

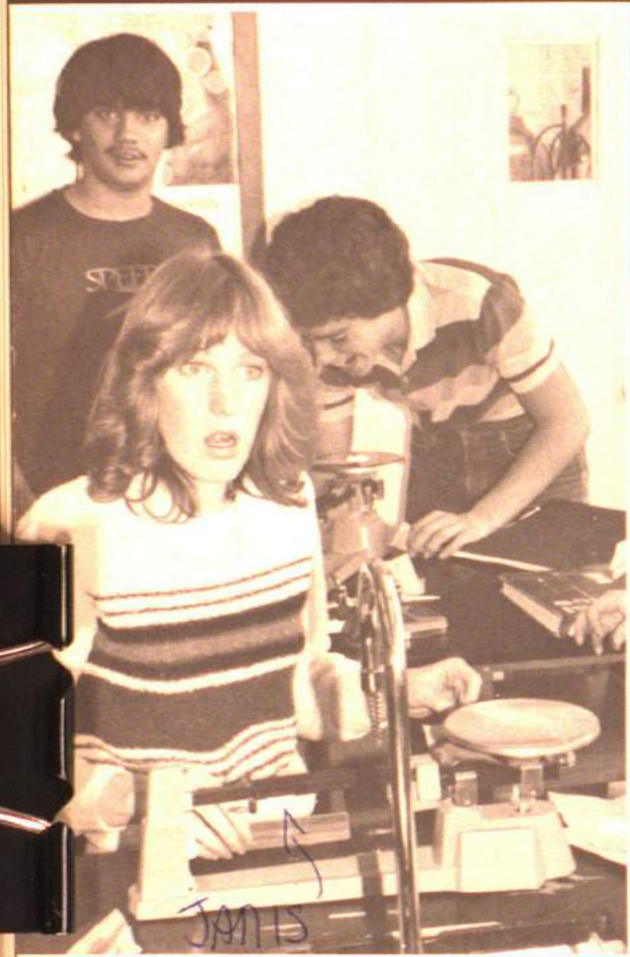
EPILOGUE
