A man carrying scissors came with a very sad expression on his face.

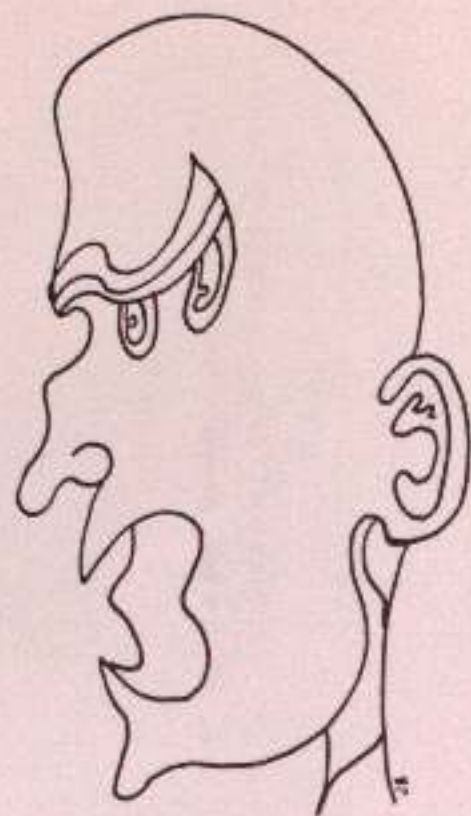
"I'm sorry to have to do this leaf," he said. "It will all be over in a matter of seconds."

RETIRING TEACHERS



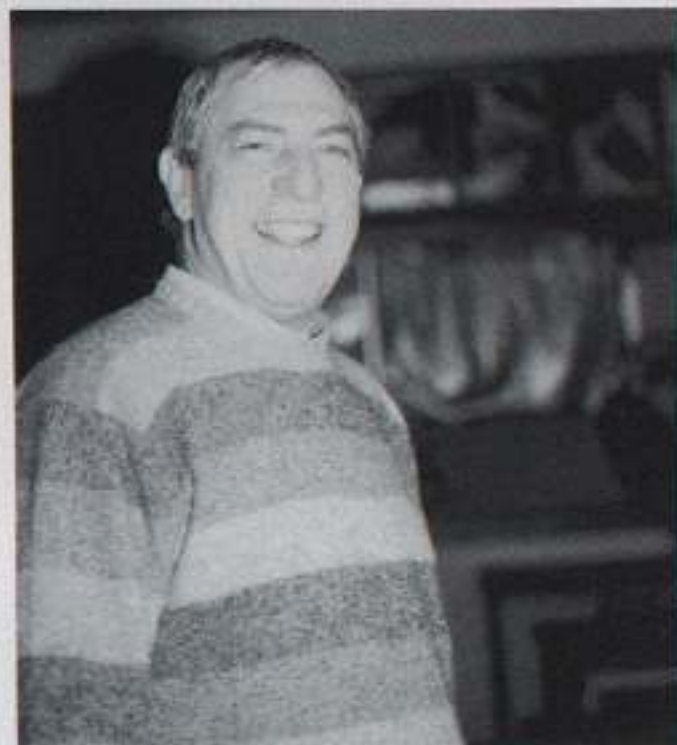

Descartes

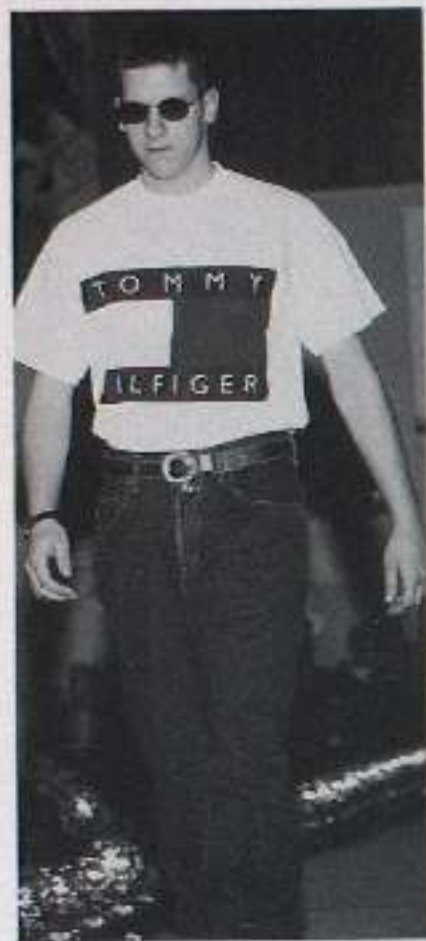
