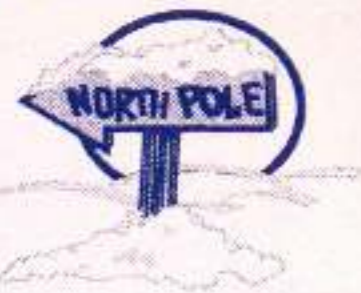


UPCCP

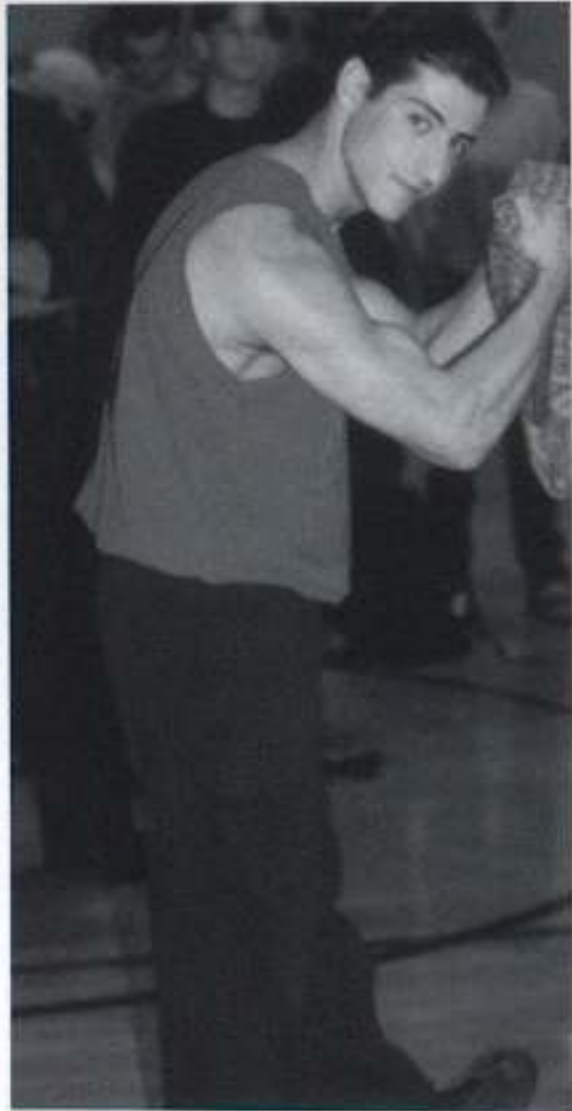

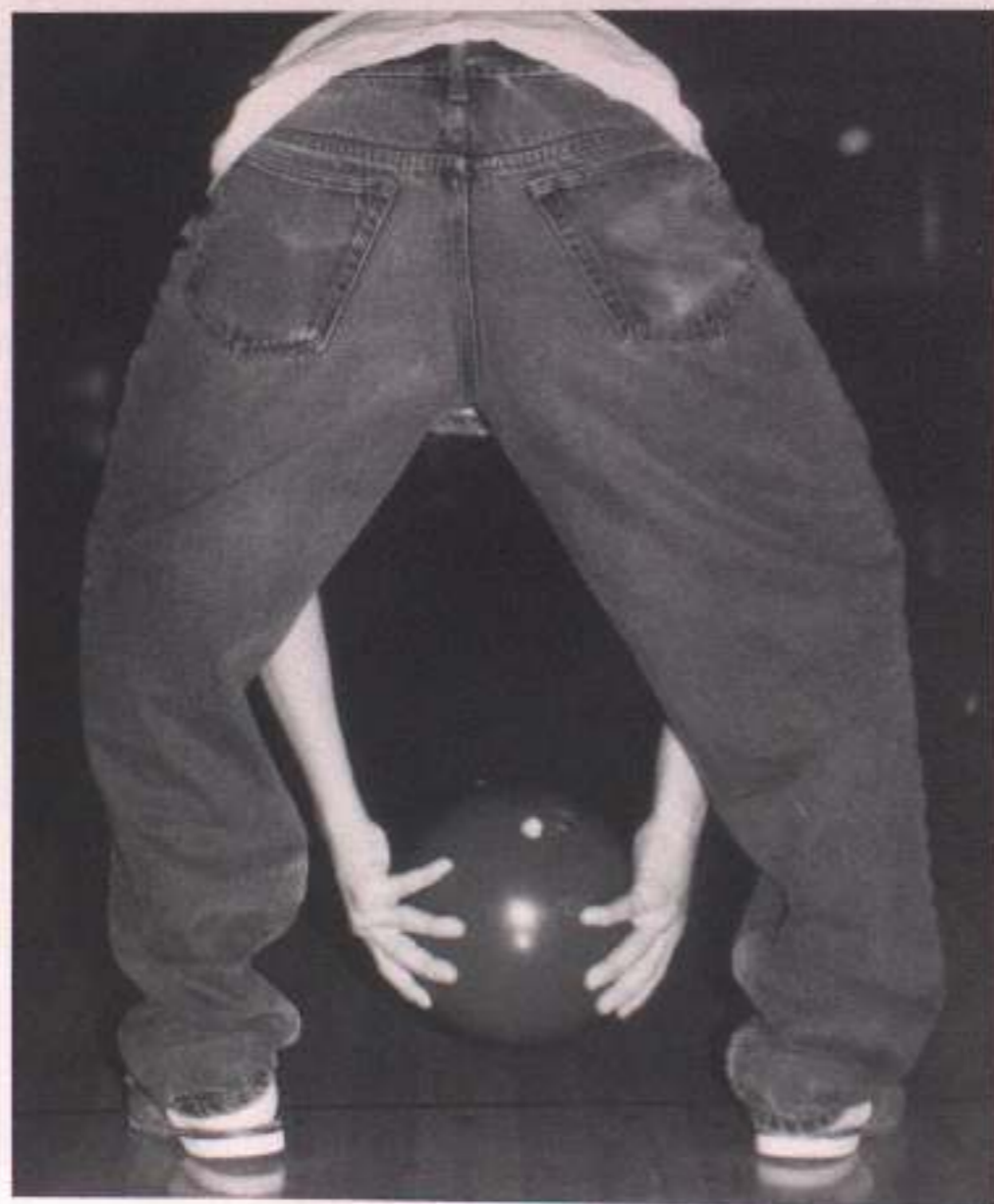
ROCK 'N BOWL

The Webster's Dictionary definition of initiation: to introduce a person to a new field, interest, or skill. To admit a member into membership, as with ceremonies or rituals.

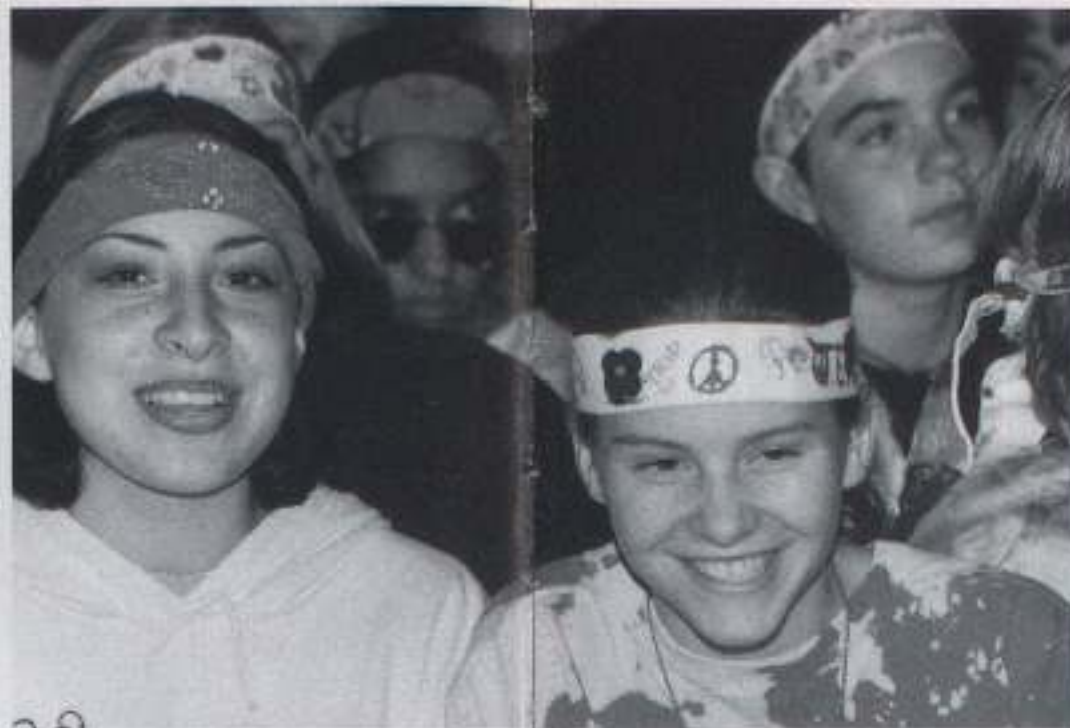
Massey's definition: A cat food tossing, pie throwing, honey messing, lip synching, Mueller fighting, horse kissing assembly!

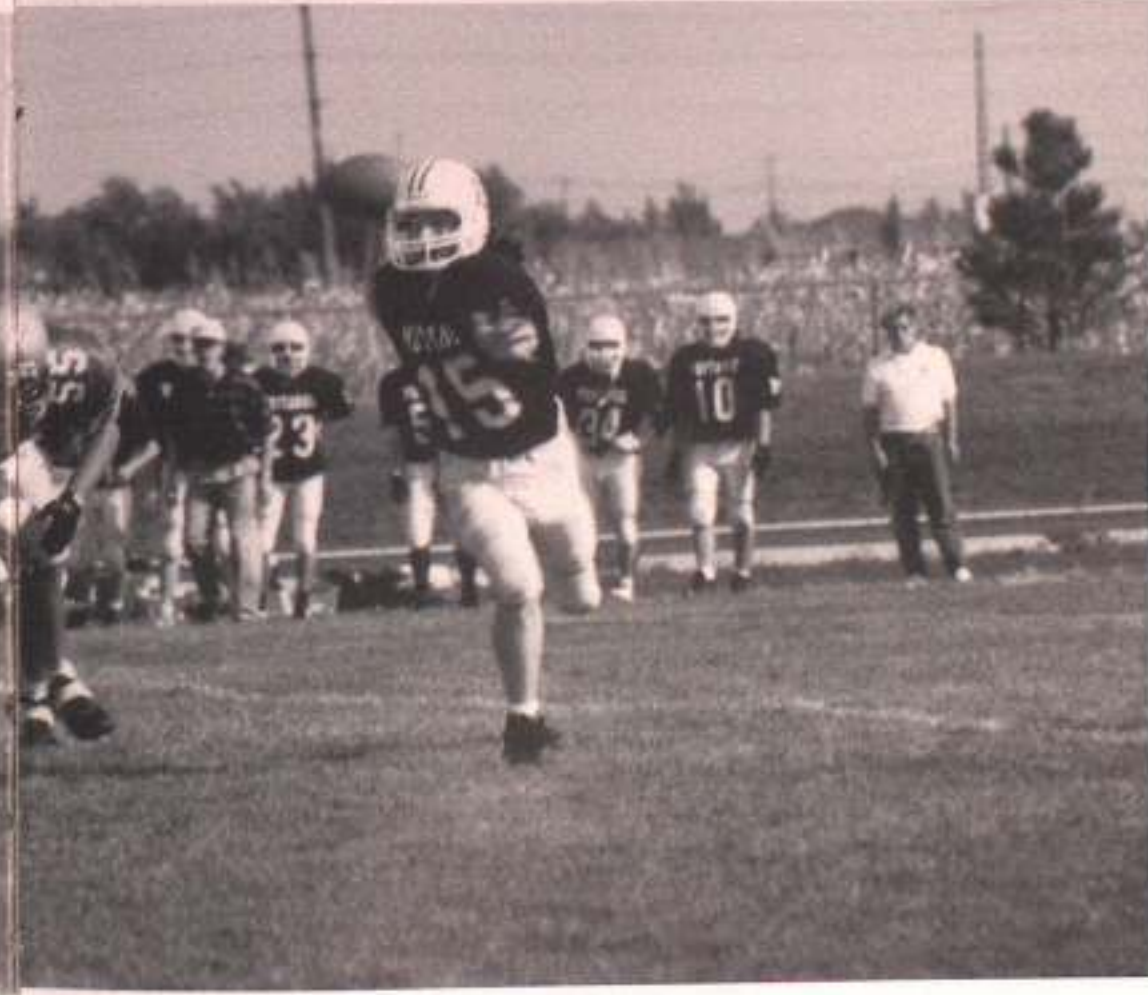

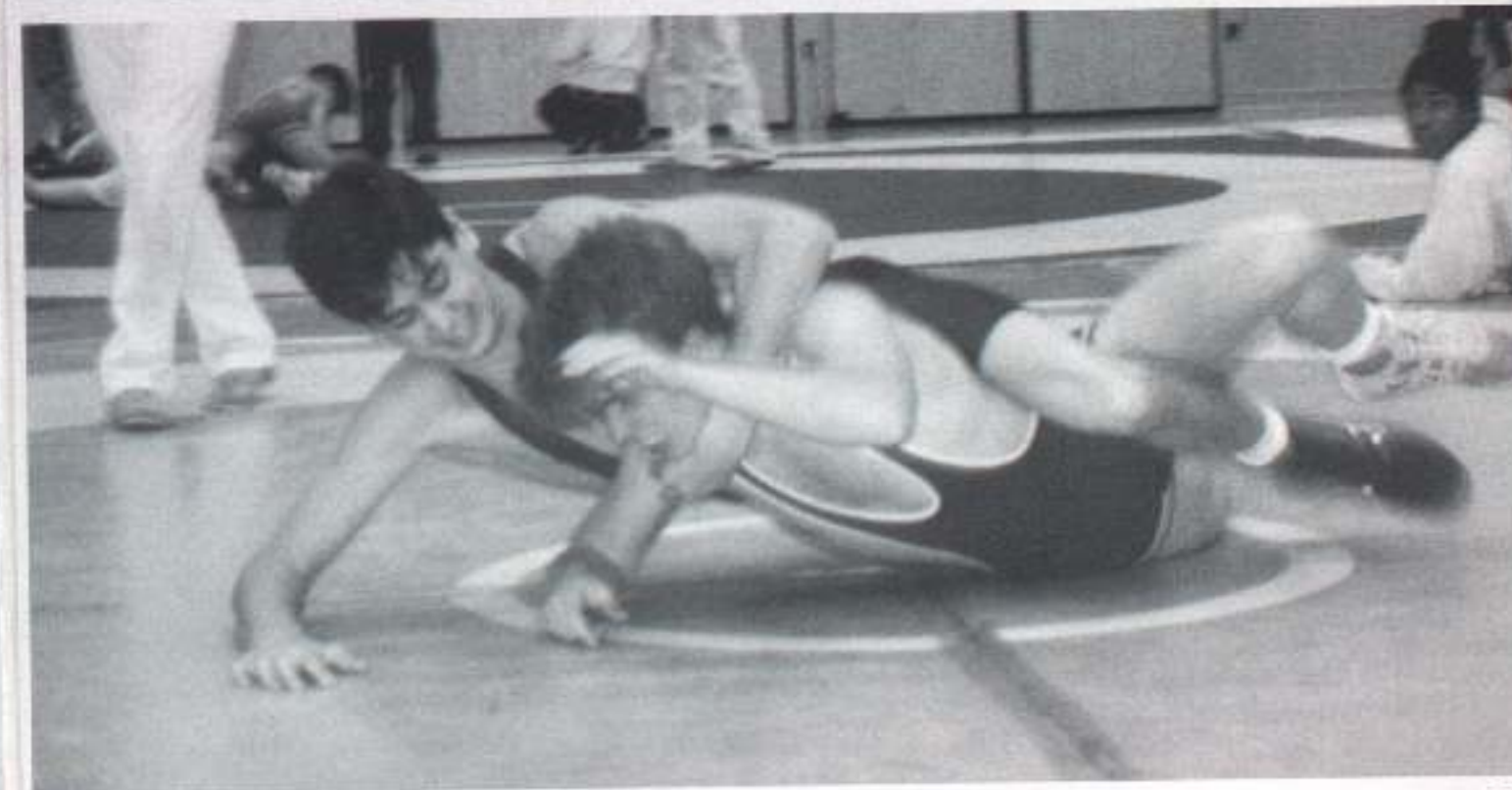
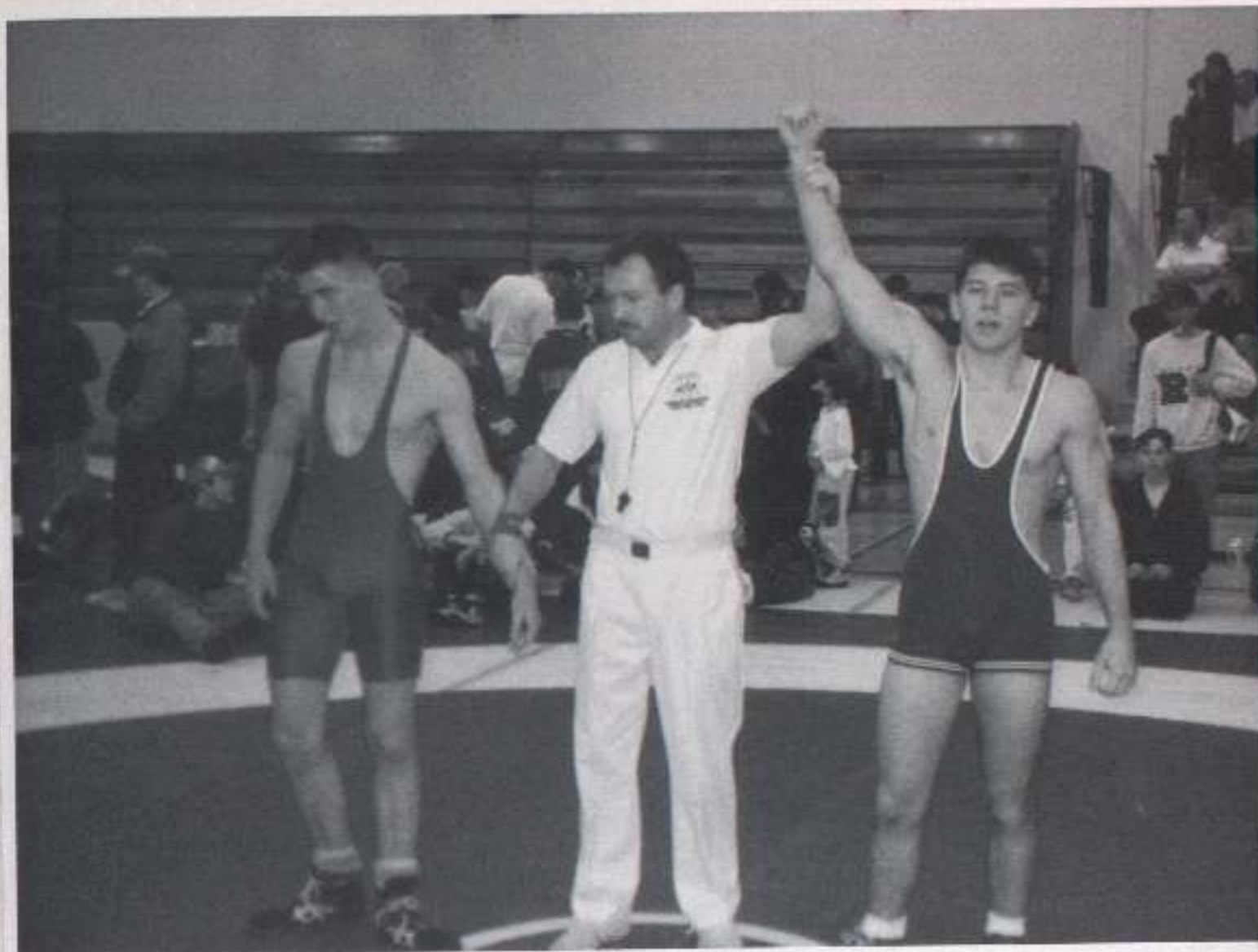
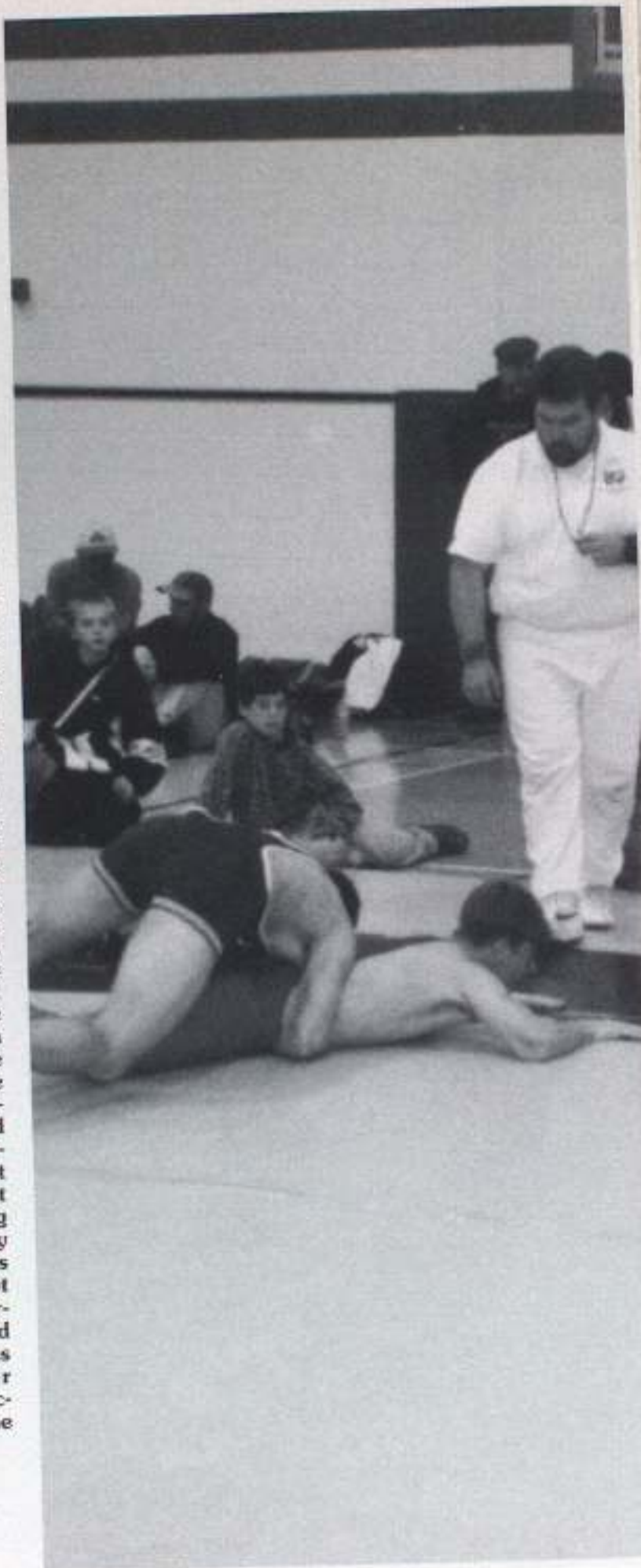
The 1995/1996 Massey Mustang Wrestling season was nearly destroyed with an ill-fated accident. One member of Massey's two man wrestling team, Ken
