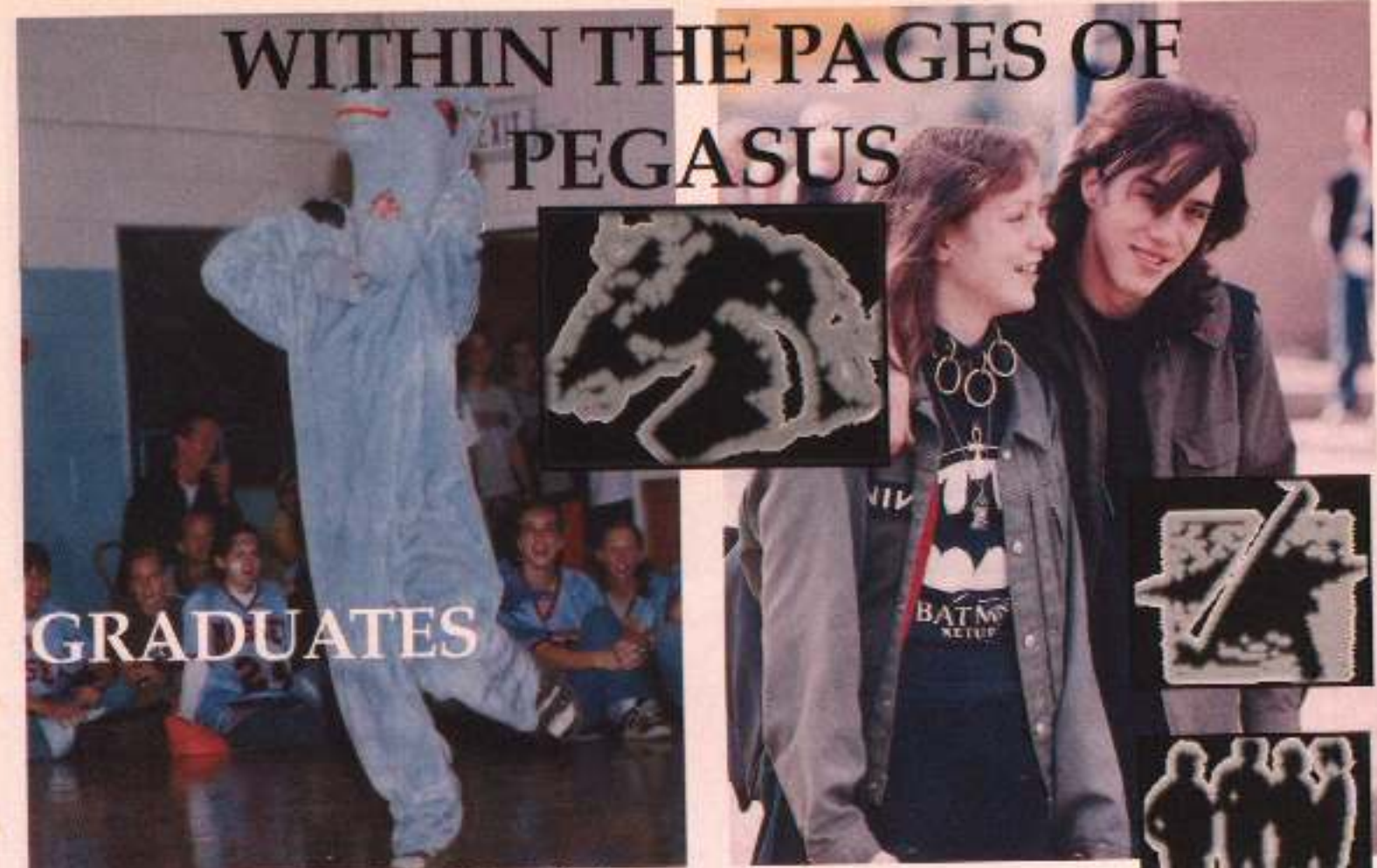

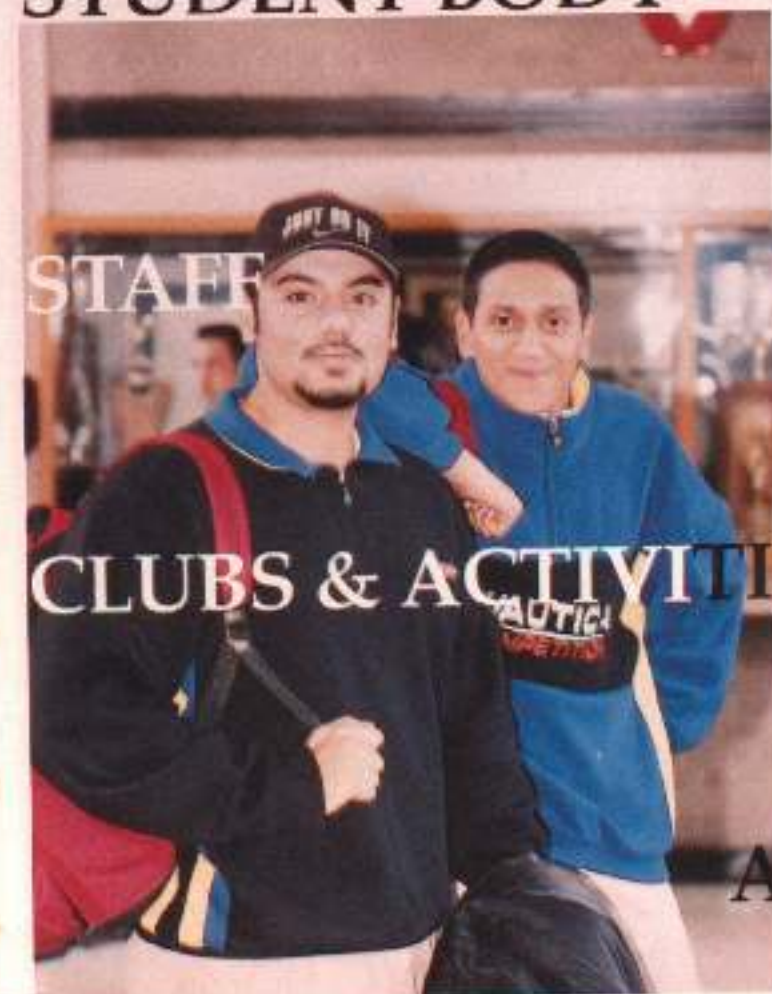

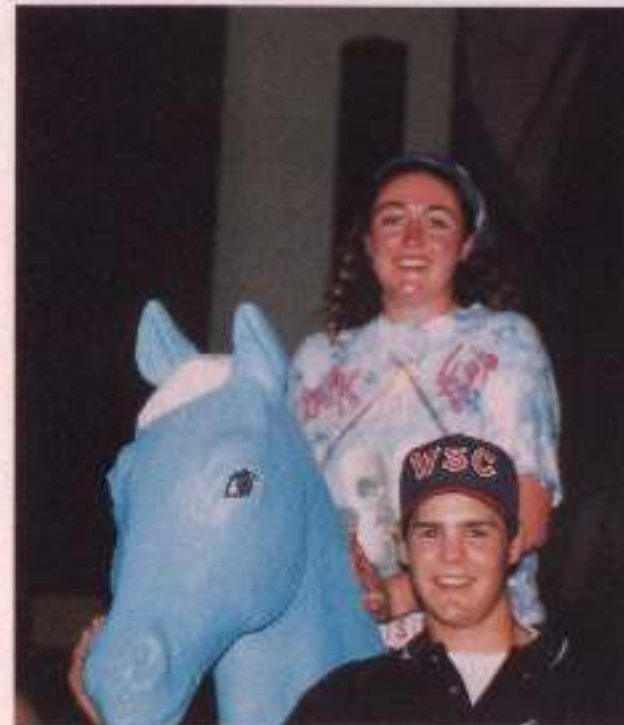

THE VIEW FROM A NINER: BY ALEX TELKA

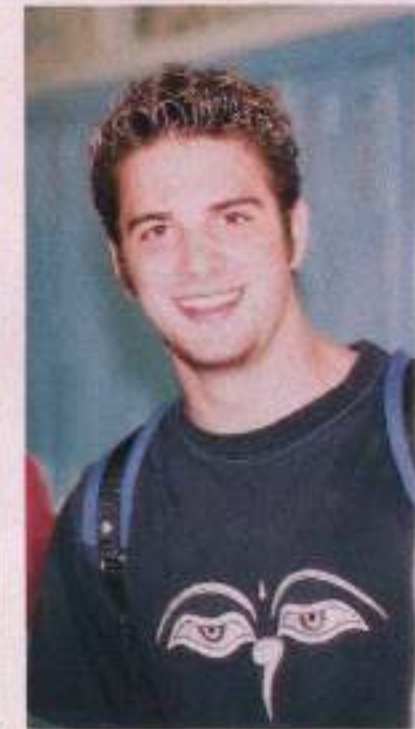

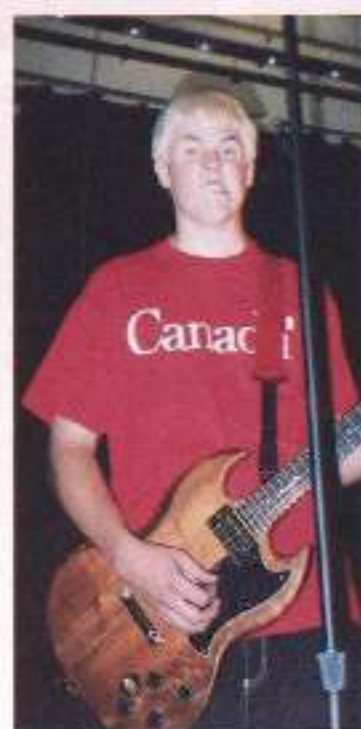
ROCKTOBER FEST '95: ROCK AND ROLL HISTORY IN THE MAKING

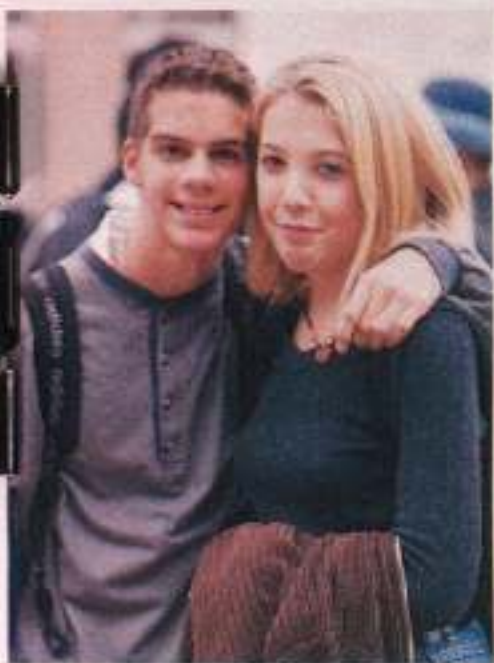
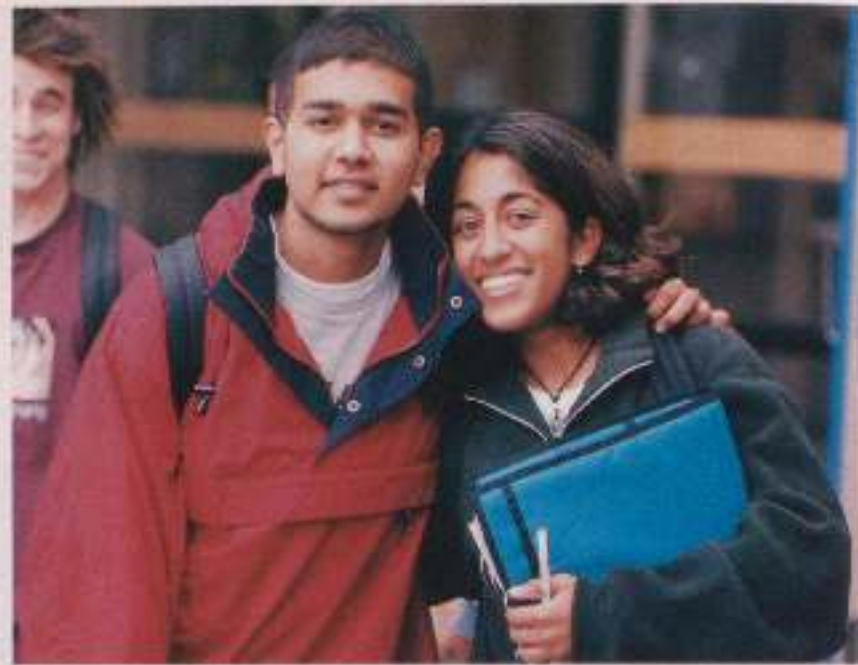

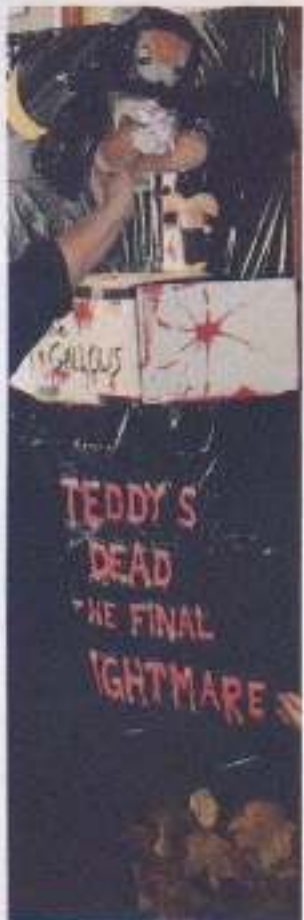

All in all this was the best Rocktober I've ever had, and I don't think many will disagree that it was theirs too!

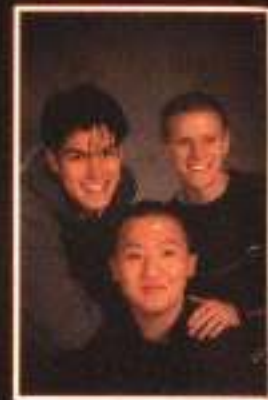
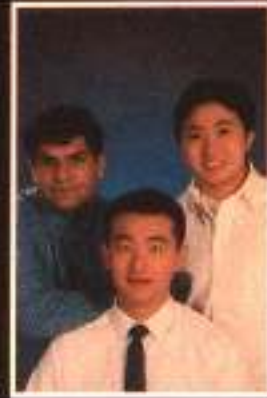

Vice Principal's Message



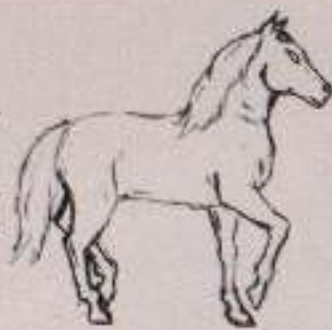

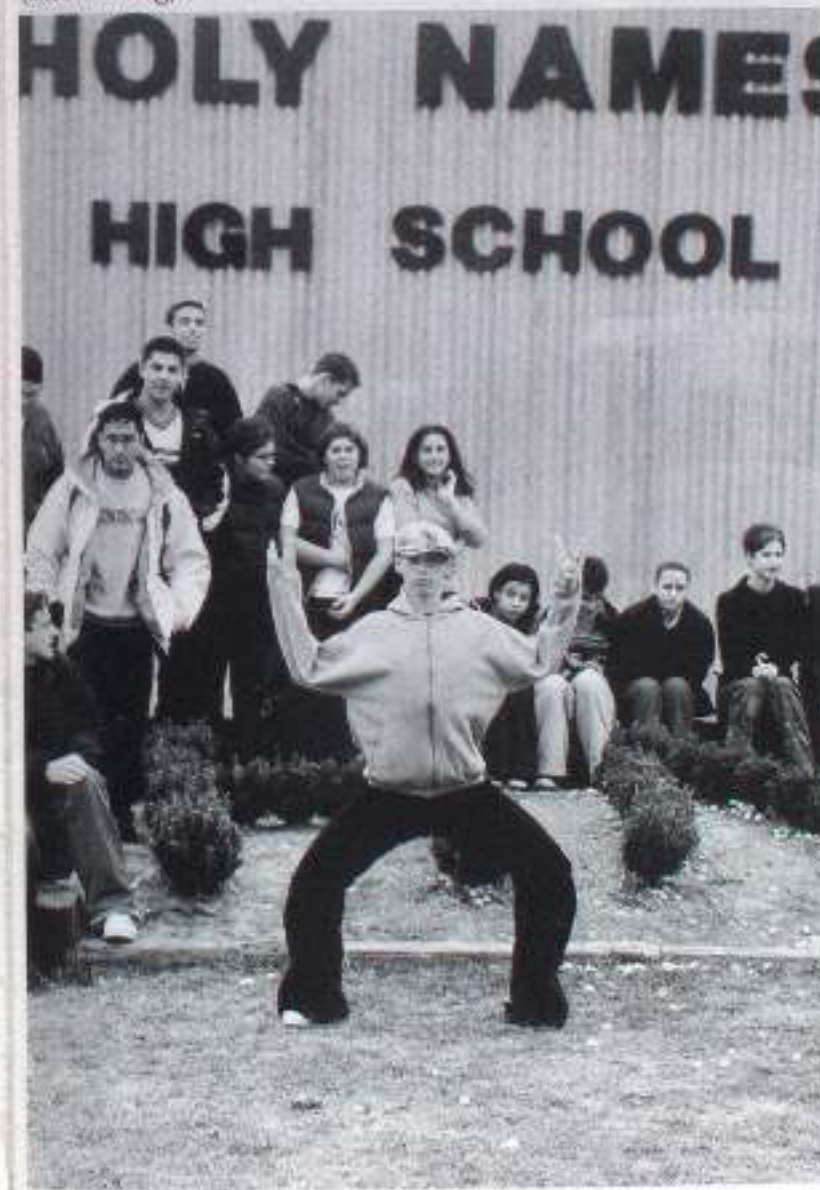
