

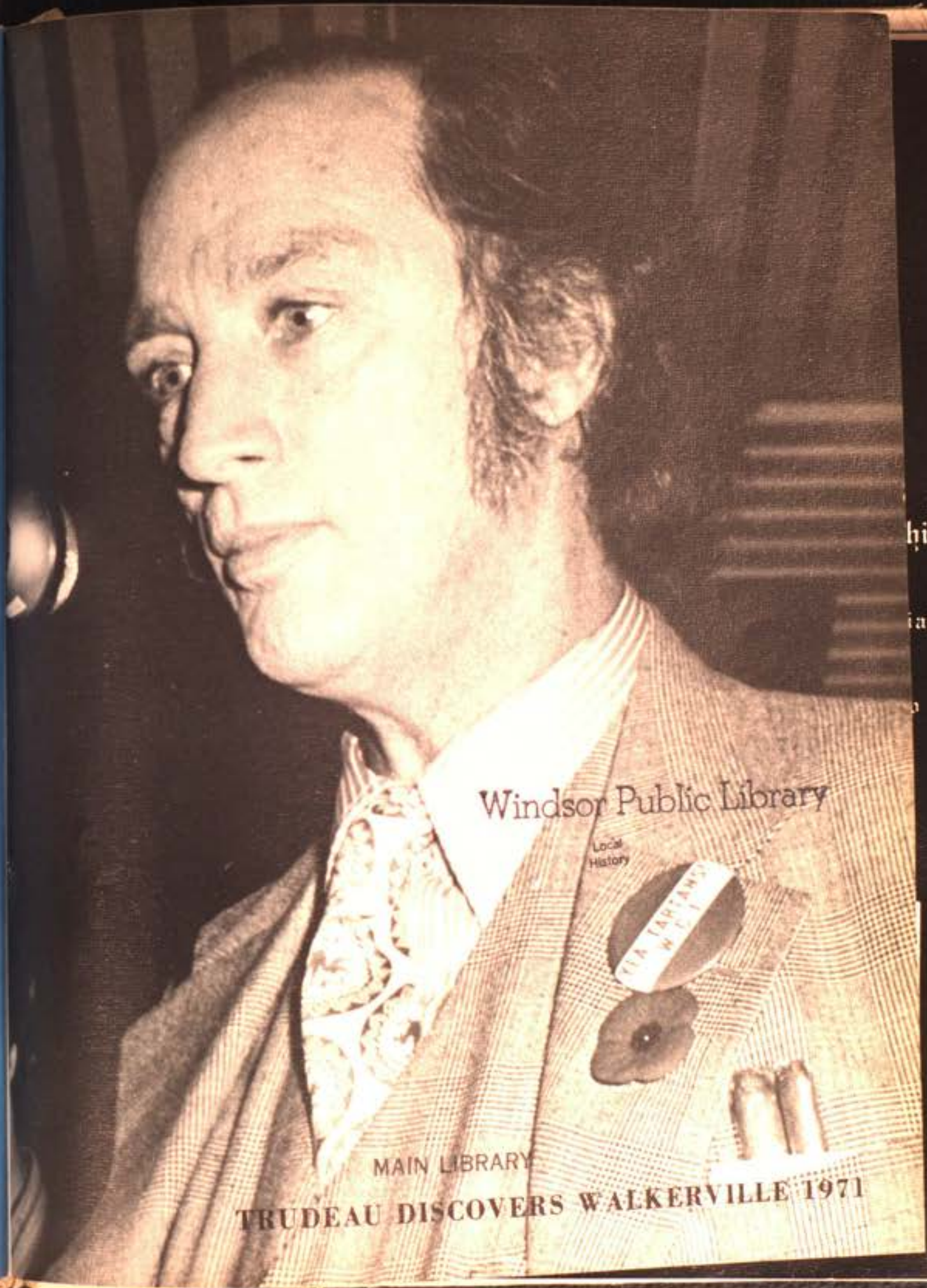

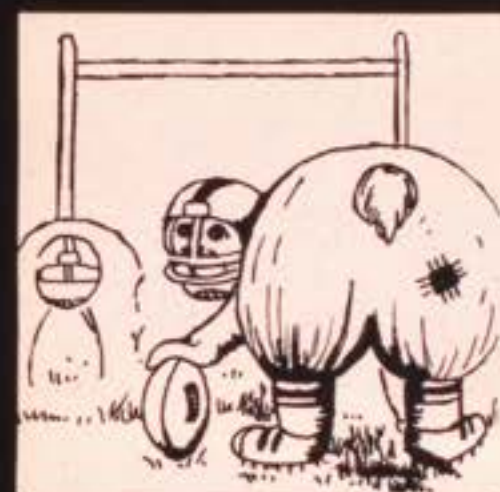

STUDENT: "I guess you could say he's pretty dashing - if you want to call it that. Some days it's like going into a psychedelic room."

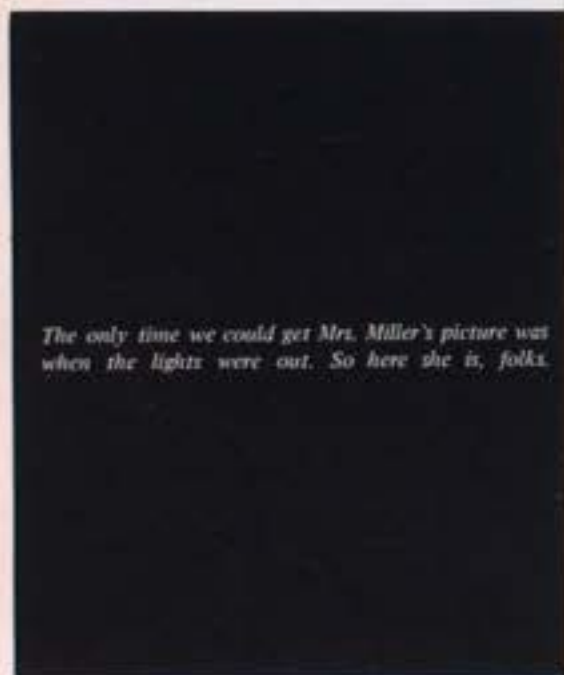

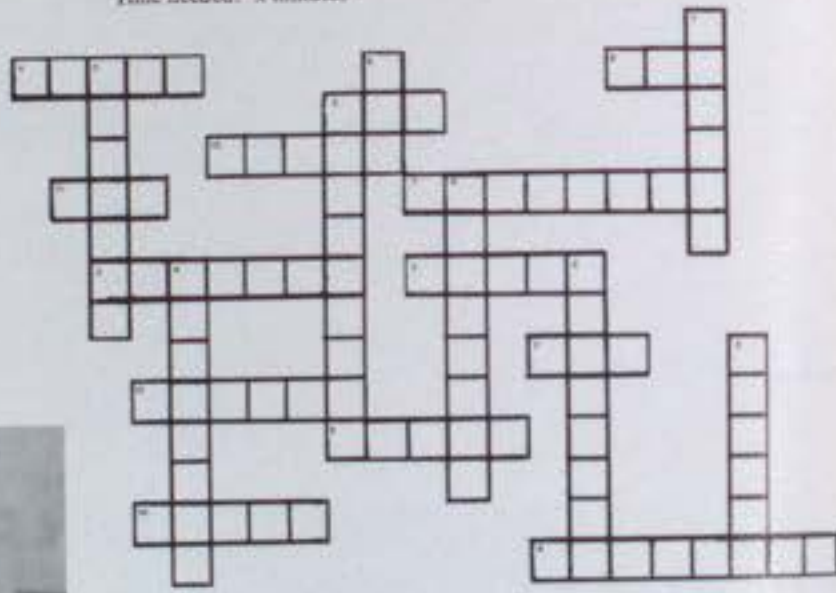

A GROUP OF REAL ACTIVISTS

When I first became President I had no previous experience with student councils, only a desire to improve the atmosphere of the school and to increase the involvement of students within the school. In this way I have found this year disillusioning and yet enlightening. I have learned about the functioning of the Agora, and have seen its successes and would like to thank all those who helped me during the year, especially my Vice-President, but most importantly of all, I have seen the limitations of this or any student council.

Most students spend the years of their life in school continually wishing they were someplace else. They respond in their classes with as much vigour as stone statues and rarely are goaded into awakening. They retreat or perhaps are driven into their own private shells and as a result a good deal of life and knowledge passes them by without the slightest danger of them being touched by it. And yet it is what the student experiences, or doesn't experience, in the classroom that he judges the school by. Student councils are powerless to change this situation not because they are oppressed or inhibited by any outside influences but because of the students, who have conditioned themselves to accept this absence of life with the false hope that the future will change what now exists. All that student councils can do is run a few dances (which are financially unprofitable), a few assemblies and raise money for clubs and activities; jobs which have to be done by somebody but no matter how successfully accomplished, still leave the basic problem untouched. And untouched it shall remain until the students themselves, by their own personal actions, in spite of the school system, change.

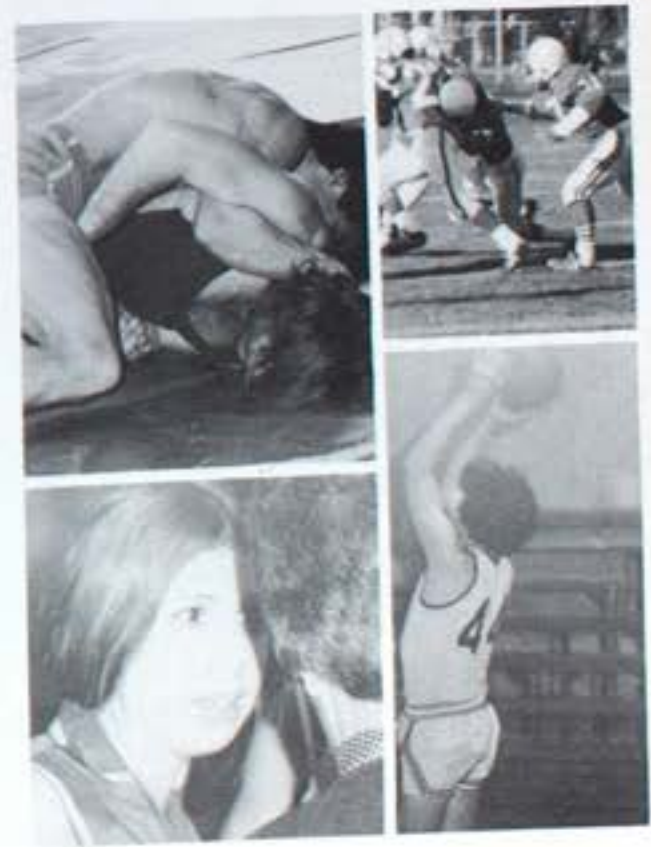

The team had great potential. Just because they played better in the mud and there weren't many rainy days, the team still gave a great effort in all their games.

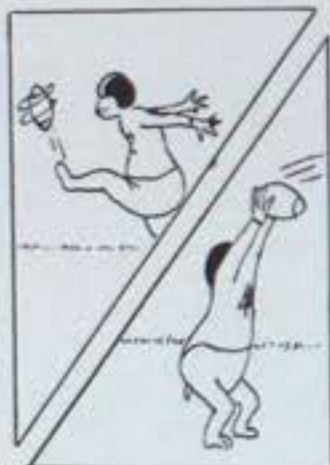
