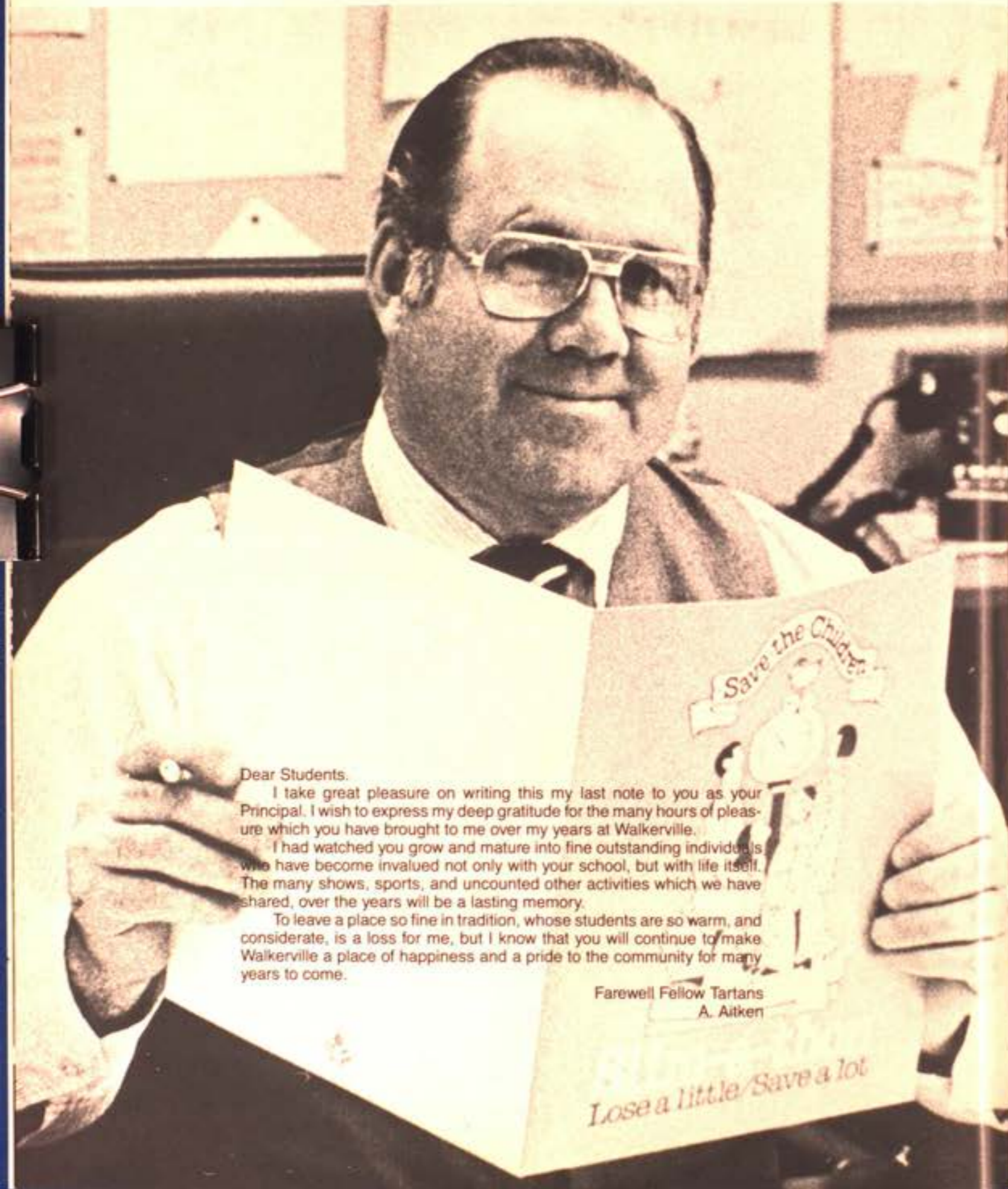

Remembering Great Tartans

In 1930, fifty years ago, at Hamilton, Ontario, the first British Empire Games were celebrated. Eleven countries competed with 400 athletes taking part.

The only Windsor area competitor among Canada's contingent was Walkerville's Art Scott. He distinguished himself by winning a silver medal as the Canadian team placed second in relay competition.

Four years later, at the second British Empire Games held at London, England, Scott again represented Canada. Again, he won a silver medal for his efforts on behalf of Canada's relay team.

As a schoolboy at Walkerville, the lanky speedster had set a WSSA track record in 1928 which has endured to this day. His accomplishment consisted of five firsts gained at the senior boys' level. He was first in the 100 yards, 220 yards, 440 yards, low hurdles and triple jump. Although tied by Kennedy's renowned Johnny Loaring in 1935, Scott's standard of five firsts has never been broken at the senior level. The longevity of this track achievement is remarkable and is indicative of the calibre and versatility of Art Scott's track prowess.

Another durable record of which he was a part was the Canadian relay mile standard set in 1933. Two former Tartans, the greater quarter-miler, Bill Fritz and basketball star, Glen Sherman, and Tech's Ray Lauzon, all running under the auspices of the Windsor Olympic Club set that mark. It was not broken until fourteen years later when Windsor's Jack Parry (Forster) and Bill Laroche (Assumption) and London's McFarlane brothers, Bob and Don, teamed up in the livery of the University of Western Ontario to establish a new mark in 1947.

Fifty years after the inaugural of the British Empire Games at Hamilton, it is a pleasure for me to recall for all Tartans the accomplishment of one of Walkerville's great track stars, Art Scott.

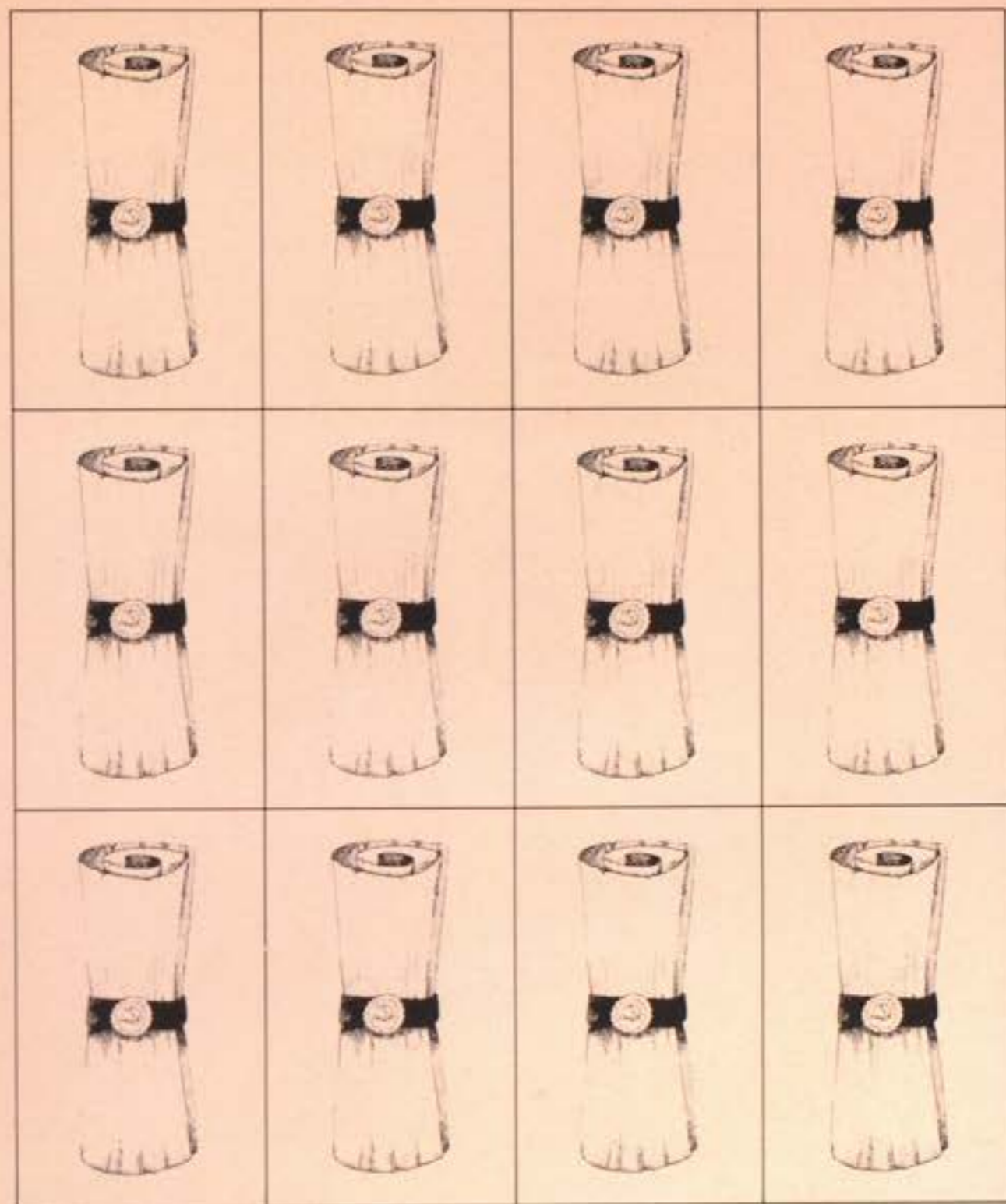

HONOR SOCIETY

Having a position on Walkerville's Honor Society is not an easy task. It means devoting a large part of your life to school activities to achieve the required minimum of 100 pts. The student must use discipline and hard work to display his talents, and he has to spread his talents too. There is a maximum from at least 3 of the 4 categories allowed: athletics, academics, clubs, and services. When this has been achieved, the student is awarded a gold medallion and an Honor Society Crest.

If a student really has ambition, he can try for the Honour Society Ring, with 175 pts. or ultimately the Honour Society Award, the highest achievement possible with at least 250 pts. The winner of this award receives an individual trophy and will have his photograph displayed in the school library.

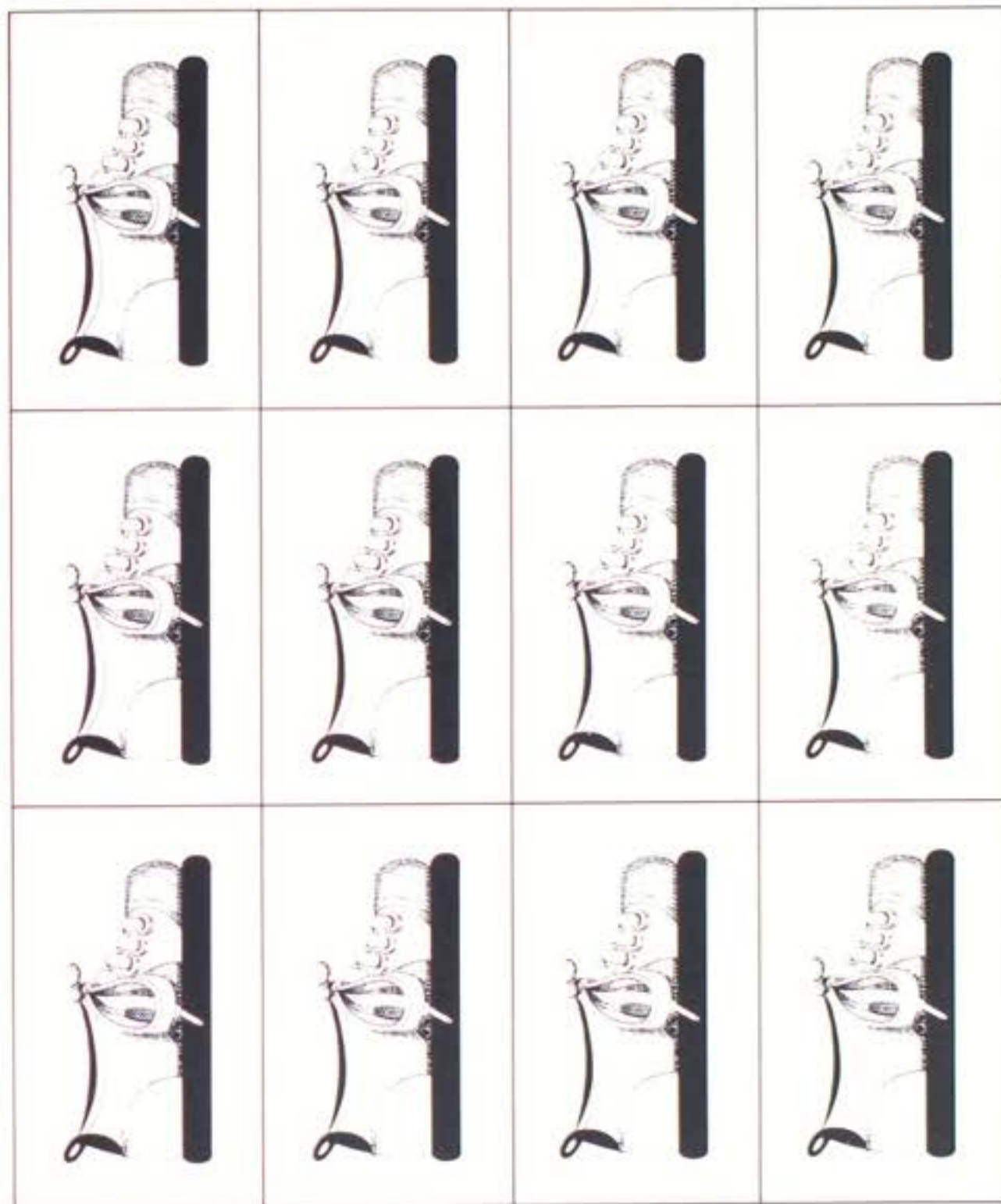
What's Happening and What's Not
