In 1940, Mr. Brown was employed as
head of both the Commercial and Guidance Departments of Kennedy Collegiate. In 1952, he became vice-princtpal of Walkerville Collegiate and four years later was appointed principal.

Since 1952, Mr, Brown has witnessed a great many ohanges within our bullding. He has seen a new gym opened and just recently a new musio room, library, and several new classrooms have been added. Our school is constantly changing and so are the courses offered withtn it. There is much more opportunity for the eager student now and our prinoipal has always been pleased to see new courses being made avallable. The development of the art and musio programmes has increased during the past few years and this meets much with the approval of Mr. Brown.

Upon his leaving, our principal has this to say to the student body and teachers of this school; "I will be very sorry to leave Walkerville Collegiate, which has, I believe, the finest group of students in Ontario. However, 1 am pleased to contribute towards introducing a new school, built for a new type of educational programme."

It is hard for us to say good-bye to a man like Mr. Brown, who has helped us so much and has been such in great asset to the school. We are grateful for the years Mr. Brown has spent at Walkerville and we wish him the best of luck as principal of Windsor's new Centennial Secondary School.

We recelved a trophy for the largest sum raised by any Windsor secondary school. Congratulations to organizer Larry Konyu and to all those who marched.

I should like to express my gratitade and appreciation to the industrious and co-oporative Inner Executive: David Young (Vice-president), Cathy Whiteside (Secretary), Jennifer Lacy ('Treasurer), Margle Anderson (Social Commlttee), and Ray Rush (Assembly Committee).
