My Poster Child

She was born in Gosfield North in 1933. Altogether she had ten brothers and two sisters although one brother died as a baby and another drowned near Point Pelee at aged 16. She led a normal child's life until August 8, 1939 when she was struck with crippling polio. She was rushed to the hospital and put in isolation. The entire family was also quarantined. However, the next week, her sister, Verla, was also struck down. Fortunately she was not crippled.

After she was released from isolation, the doctors tried to make her lie flat on a canvas bed, somewhat like a small trampoline, for two years. She didn't think much of that idea and she slightly disobeyed. Instead of lying flat as she was supposed to, she sat in a little wooden rocking chair and managed to manipulate it everywhere. When it came to stairs she had that figured out too. She would throw the chair down the stairs and then she would bump down on her "derrière" and climb back up in her chair and be on her way, maybe to play baseball with the neighbourhood children.

At the age of eight she received her first pair of braces and crutches. Because of all this she couldn't possibly attend a regular elementary school but the Board was helpful. She received private tutoring up until grade eight, when two boys joined her. They were also crippled. Every summer she spent at Blue Mountain Camp for the Crippled. From 1942 until 1945 she was Windsor's Poster Child. She was also a representative for the Easter Seals and every Christmas she was chosen to read a poem at the party for crippld children at the Prince Edward Hotel.

When it came time for high school the Board was again very helpful. They paid for a cab to pick her up and take her to and from Patterson Collegiate where she graduated from grade ten as a secretary and bookkeeper.

In 1952, she was married and moved to Prince Edward Island where her new husband was stationed in the air force. Nine months later she had to move back to Windsor because she found it too difficult to get her braces repaired.

In 1954 she gave birth to her first child. Eleven months later her second child was born and then thirteen months later she delivered a stillborn child. In 1959 and 1964 she gave birth to her last two children.

She has brought up a family, held a steady job, and much more than some non-handicapped people would ever attempt. She is a great and courageous lady and I am very proud to be her daughter.
