Our Main Man

It is September the sixth, 1988 and the windows on the front of the school are being ripped out. Perhaps school will start late this year. This does not happen as teachers and students play "musical classrooms" for several months and work around the intersection of the new windows.

As Walkerville's physical renewal continues so too does the renewal of its students' achievements in all domains. Scholarships increase, many more athletic teams make it to the play offs and some championships are won. We win the city Chess Championship. Our Peace Links club raises enough money to save more acres of Costa Rica's rain forest. Our Red Cross Blood drives are a great success and we raise twice the money for U.N.I.C.E.F. that we raised last year. The graduation Ceremony and Awards Banquets are class acts and school productions such as the Fashion Show and the Free Trade Debate, organized and presented almost entirely by students, continue to impress the community at large. Our Community Living Program remains strong and more students move to our area to take advantage of this program. Walkerville is named the School for the New Extended Arts Program.

As always education is alive and well at Walkerville in 1988. Thanks to all for another great year.

Defence key to Tartans

At this time of year, with the weather so unpredictable, football teams are always wondering if they are outlasted in the proper footwear.

When the Walkerville Tartans take the field for tonight's WSSA Wilson Conference senior football final with the Lowe Trojans, the only appropriate footwear would have to be giant slippers.

The Tartans, 1-6 during the regular season, have turned into the Cinderella story of the high school football season. They knocked off Amherst (5-2) and undefeated Forster (7-0) en route to tonight's matchup with the Trojans (3-4) at Windsor Stadium beginning at 7 p.m.

"We've certainly peaked at the right time," said Tartans' coach Bob Miller. "I have to give all of the credit to

(defensive coordinator) John Parrett," he continued. "He's really turned our defence around."

The Tartans defence, which allowed 92 points in its first four games, held Amherst to 14 in a 17-14 win and stopped powerful Forster by limiting the Spartans to eight points.

The defence produced the 11-6 victory over Forster when Scott Keck recovered a Spartans' fumble before running 48 yards for the winning touchdown.

KECK ALSO returned a blocked field for the winning TD in Walkerville's only regular-season win, a 14-6 decision over Belle River. That victory earned the Tartans the sixth-and-final playoff spot ahead of the Nobles, who were also 1-6.

Runners Glen Skinner and Tony Picchioni and kicker Lazar Acamovic are Walkerville's chief weapons. But with only eight offensive TDs in nine

games, the Tartans will be hard-pressed to score against a Lowe defence which specializes in forcing turnovers.

The Trojans earned six turnovers, two for touchdowns, in their 28-14 semi-final win over Riverside.

"We've got the best defence in the league," Lowe's Bill Lafave said.

Offensively, Lafave and Clarence Simpson anchor a ground attack which charged out 352 yards versus the Rebels. Simpson ran for 100 yards and scored three TDs in Lowe's 22-14 regular-season triumph over Walkerville.

Trojans' quarterback Henry Gambell has an outstanding receiver in Ralph Mahann while Brian Murphy is a deadly accurate kicker.

Like the Tartans, the Trojans feel they are hitting their stride. "I think Riverside peaked too early," says Lafave. "But we've pleased it just right. We're going to peak in the final."

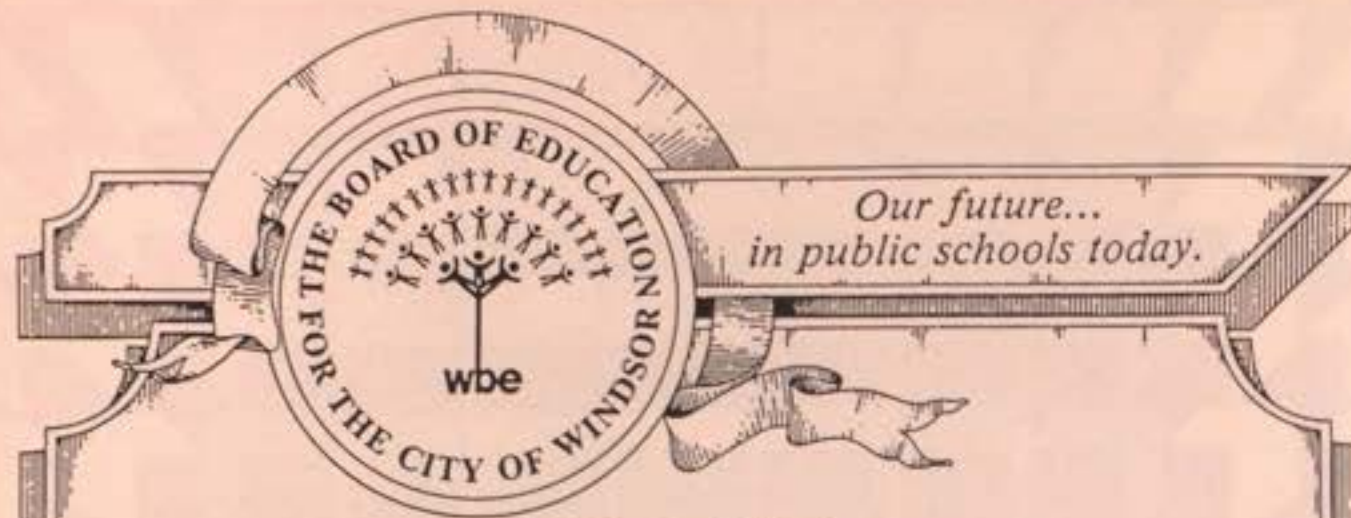
