I stand silent in thought, trying to imagine what on earth she could be so happy about. She's in a thrift store for goodness sake!

Then I overhear her talking to her mother. She's raving about how much she loves shopping here.

I immediately think that her parents must be in need of money or maybe they have too many children and can't afford to clothe them all in Campuscrew attire.

I begin to feel bad for the girl. I see myself, standing there in an American Eagle sweater, Campuscrew jeans, and Roxy shoes. This is how I have dressed since I was about ten. I could not imagine buying any of my everyday clothes from a thrift store. I think of how embarrassed she must feel, walking around in other people's clothes. She tells her she will be waiting in the car because she doesn't want to be seen in this dump.

It was the first dramatic production staged in close to seven years and was a resounding success! In the spring we staged the musical *Oklahoma*. This classic western was very well received by the community, with packed houses each and every night. This was a true team production. In her spare time, Mrs. Peters was appointed the new department head for the WCI Arts department. Our WCCA Instrumentalists, led by an incredibly talented group of tutors (Chris Ingratta, Jerilee Preston, Catey Fitzpatrick, Kathryn Zatlenga and Peter Wiebe), had many strong performances at the Kiwanis Music Festival and held year-end recitals with our vocalists, dancers and pianists. Mr. Allison and Mr. Lock combined the Media and Visual Art departments to create two incredible sets for the major productions. They also coordinated WCCA's "Arts in the School". This amazing weekend ran during "Art in the Park" where doors and the surrounding area of our school were opened up to the public. We were able to display the talents of our students to thousands of Windsor's population. This enormous project was guided by the entire WCCA staff and was a tremendous success.

The WCCA was able to travel to Detroit to see *The Producers*, to Toronto where they watched *Hairspray* and their major trip took them to Chicago for an amazing three days of Performing Arts in the Windy City! Next year we are looking forward to a new partnership with St. Clair College and their Music Theatre Program coming into our school. Also, we are planning on performing *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest* and *A Chorus Line* in the spring as our major productions.

I would like to thank all of the amazing staff in the WCCA Program for making my first year as Program Director a huge success. I would also like to thank Mr. Antaya for his wonderful support of the Arts and his assistance in many major decisions. Lastly, I would like to thank Gienna for her unlimited amount of hours and dedication to WCCA and WCI. She has made my job and life much easier by providing me guidance and by putting me in my place when needed. Here is to many more years of WCCA!

A Windsor high school teacher for 31 years, Mr. Swierenga was known for his enthusiastic coaching of sports, including volleyball, curling and tennis, but his love of cave exploring, or spelunking, earned him a special niche. He had pursued speleology, the study of caves, since university. For 25 years, he organized caving expeditions throughout the U.S. and Canada for high school students, helping them to learn about geology, the sport he loved, and most of all, about themselves. Ms. Houston, longtime friend, describes him as "so involved with everybody. He would do anything for the kids. He was a dad figure to all of them."



WCI Girls' First Baseball Team!
