

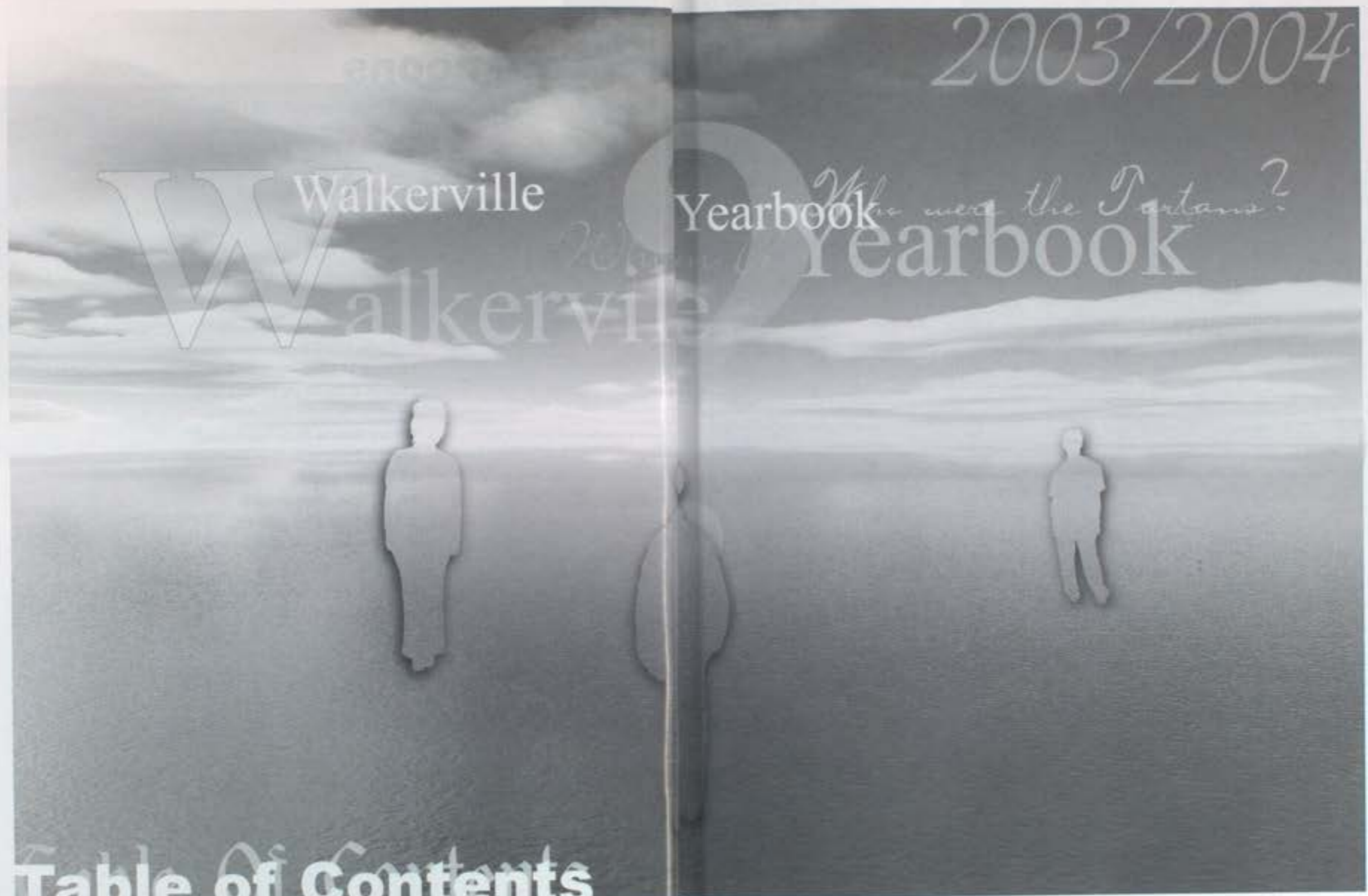


Teaspoons

Also, we are planning on performing *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest* and *A Chorus Line* in the spring as our major productions.

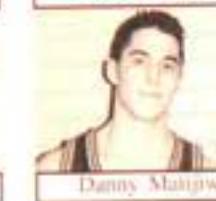
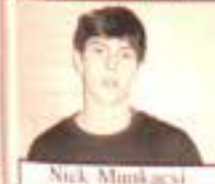
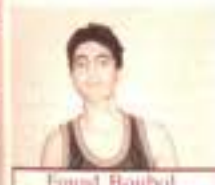
Boys' Basketball

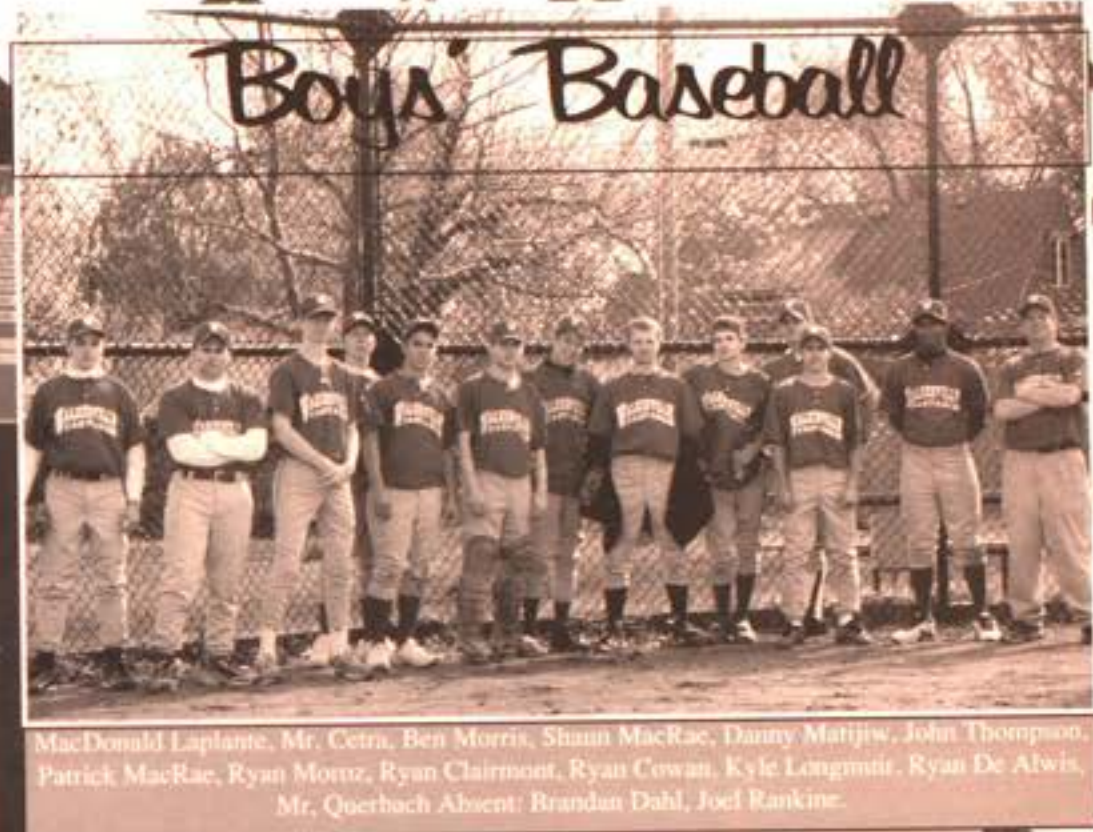

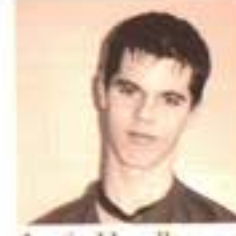

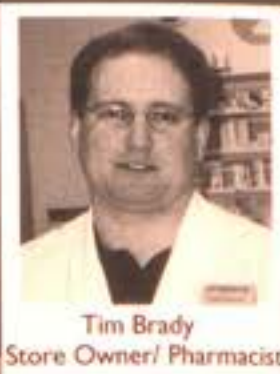
